In the 1770's the U.S. consisted of 13 colonies under the rule of England's King George III. The colonists were unhappy with the way they were being ruled. They were being forced to pay a tax to England and they had no one over in England standing up for them. Because of the colonist's unrest, King George sent troops over to the colonies to help control any rebellion. In 1775 the King's troops advanced on Concord, Massachusetts and it was there that the first bullet was shot. It was referred to as the "shot heard round the world." and it marked the unofficial beginning of the colonies war independence.



this point newly Αt the appointed Congress had not formally declared war, but by June 1776, their efforts to work their differences England failed. They decided to form a committee which would compose a formal declaration independence. This committee included John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Philip Livingston and Roger Sherman. Thomas Jefferson

was chosen to write the first draft which after various changes was accepted on July 4, 1776 by nine out of the thirteen states. To make it official, John Hancock, President of the Continental Congress signed the Declaration of Independence, making it legal.

The first holiday was first observed in Philadelphia on July 8, 1776, but it was not declared a legal holiday until 1941. It is celebrated publicly with parades, pageants, and fireworks to symbolize the fight independence from England. On the Fourth of July we remember who we are. where we've come from and what we've accomplished as a people. It's an amazing fact of American history and one that we'll never forget, as long as we continue our Fourth of July celebrations.

MILITARY: HEARING AIDS FOR MILITARY RETIREES

The Defense Department's Retiree-At-Cost Hearing Aid Program (RACHAP) helps retirees buy hearing aids through certain military medical facilities at a government-negotiated cost.

The hearing aids provided are the same as those available to active-duty service members. The program is open to retirees who have hearing loss or tinnitus (ringing in the ears). Dependents of military retirees are not eligible.

Retirees can use any military treatment facility that provides the program and will accept them; you don't need to return to your service affiliation to participate in this program. Contact one near you for more details.

In addition to certain military treatment facilities, the Department of Veterans Affairs offers RACHAP to retirees who live within a 75mile radius of the James A. Lovell Federal Health Care Center in North Chicago, Illinois.

Retirees can obtain hearing aids at significant savings: Two hearing aids usually cost less than \$2,000. Exact costs are variable and subject to change at any time without notice. Contact your nearest audiology clinic for further details.

Not every military medical facility is able to provide this program. Care of active-duty members takes precedence at all military treatment facilities. It is recommended that you contact the appropriate military facility before incurring significant travel

expenses. Facilities may discontinue this program for any reason.

Note: Your closest clinic could be located hundreds of miles away from your home. The costs to travel for this program need to be considered versus the availability of an audiologist in your local community to assist you with repairs, re-programming, etc.

Retirees who are VA beneficiaries may also be eligible for hearing aids free of charge from the VA. In most cases, there is no cost to the patient.

Dependents of retirees are not eligible for hearing aid services from RACHAP. Retirees eligible for care at a military treatment facility and retiree family members covered by Tricare are eligible for hearing evaluations, and the audiologist can provide them with more information about hearing aids or local providers. They may be able to get discounted hearing aids at a military clinic. Tricare began covering hearing aids for the children of retirees in

Military retirees from active-duty, National Guard and reserve units who have hearing loss and/or tinnitus are eligible to participate in the RACHAP. Retired commissioned officers of the U.S. Public Health Service may also be eligible.

THE SECRET LIFE OF EVERYDAY GADGETS

You put your phone down. Close your laptop. Step away from the smart speaker. You think you've hit pause, that the lights go out and the gadgets sleep. But no. The show goes on.

Welcome to the quieter side of your electronics — a collection of clicks, pings, hums, and whirs that continue after hours. While you relax with a beverage or watch late night TV, your devices remain active. They're handling updates, syncing with cloud servers, and communicating behind the scenes. Let's take a closer look at what goes on beneath the surface.

The Night Shift: What Sleep Mode Really Means

You'd think sleep is synonymous with off. It's not. Your smart TV is still listening for the wake word. Your phone is syncing email, checking location, indexing photos you forgot you took. Your gaming console? It's auto-downloading 16GB of updates you didn't ask for.

Manufacturers sell it as convenience: devices ready the moment you are. But it's also about control. They want your gadgets running maintenance tasks, pushing new features, collecting diagnostics, and, truth be told, learning more about you.

The Data Harvest Festival

When your devices aren't busy serving you, they're studying

you. That weather app? It doesn't just check the forecast. It might also ping your GPS at midnight to keep its location data fresh — info that could end up in marketing databases or shared with partners whose names you'll never know. Smart fridges monitor how often the door opens. Toothbrushes log your brushing patterns.

And all this happens in the background. You don't see it or hear it, but the servers are always online.

Phantom Firmware Updates

If your device gets smarter while you sleep, who's really in control?

Firmware updates are quiet instructions sent from tech companies to your devices—subtle but significant. They often arrive unannounced, and it's not always clear what's been altered.

In many ways, silent updates resemble unexpected home repairs. Sometimes they're useful. Sometimes they introduce new issues. But they serve as a gentle reminder: the technology we think we own often runs on terms set elsewhere.

How to Tame Your Gadgets

You don't need to ditch your devices or declare war on the cloud. But being mindful goes a long way:

- **Start small.** Unplug gadgets you're not using—chargers, old streaming boxes, anything with an ever-glowing LED. They draw power and stay quietly active when they don't need to.
- Smart plugs can help. Set schedules to fully power down devices overnight, rather than letting them idle in standby mode.
- Take a closer look at app permissions. Not every app needs

constant location access or background updates. It's okay to be selective.

• Be deliberate with updates. Turn off automatic installs if you can, and choose when and what to update. It gives you more control over what's changing.

And remember, not everything needs to be smart. Sometimes, a simple, offline tool—a French press coffee maker, a light switch—does the job just fine, without phoning home.


DATA BREACH: APPLE, GOOGLE AND FACEBOOK

16 billion Apple, Google, and Facebook login credentials, including passwords, leaked.

A compilation of over 16 billion credentials has been exposed, making it one of the largest data leaks in history. These login credentials, including passwords, were originally stolen using information-stealing malware – malicious software that gathers all the data it can find on a stored device and compiles it together. Criminals have found and repackaged this information, which is now for sale on the dark web, and if exploited, can be used to commit identity theft.



How to Kill and Prevent Bathroom Mold

Got bathroom mold on your ceiling? Here's how to San Juan, Puerto Rico, offers the following tips for get rid of it and prevent future infestations, too.

If you've never experienced bathroom mold, perhaps • you aren't looking deep enough into the corners of shower or bathe, and leave it on for 30 minutes your bathroom.

It's one of the most common problems in any house; it's also one of the easiest to prevent and cure -- as long as you haven't let it get out of hand.

"Bathroom mold occurs primarily because mold • loves damp, dark, isolated spaces," says Larry Vetter or replace it frequently. of Vetter Environmental Services in Smithtown, N.Y. "Typically, a bathtub, shower, or entire bathroom remains damp enough for mold growth just from showering or bathing."

Common Causes of Bathroom Mold

- Lingering moisture caused by lack of ventilation
- Leaky toilets, sinks, and plumbing pipes
- Damp cellulose materials such as rugs, paper can take remedial measures yourself: products, wood, wallpaper, grout, drywall, and fabric

So how do you know if you have a mold problem? that has mold growth. Matt Cinelli, owner/operator of AERC Removals in North Attleboro, Mass., says, "If you can see it or smell it, you've got it."

Finding the Mold in Your Bathroom

Bathroom mold isn't always obvious. Check out hidden areas, such as under sinks, access doors to shower and bath fixtures, around exhaust fans, even in crawl spaces and basements underneath bathrooms.

"It could be starting in the bathroom but actually forming in another room," says Cinelli, adding that

lack of proper ventilation is the biggest culprit for mold growth.

Preventing Mold

The best defense is preventing mold from occurring in the first place. Yashira Feliciano, director of housekeeping for Conrad Conado Plaza Hotel in

keeping mold out of your bathroom:

- Use your bathroom ventilation fan when you following the end of your bath; if you don't have an exhaust fan, install one.
- Keep household humidity levels below 50%; an air conditioner or dehumidifier can help.
- Use a mildew-resistant shower curtain, and wash
- Don't keep bottles of shampoo or shower gel, toys, or loofahs in the shower, as they provide places for mold to grow and hide.
- Wash your bathroom rugs frequently.

Getting Rid of Mold

What do you do if mold growth is already a problem? As long as the infestation isn't large, you

- Strip away and replace any caulking or sealant
- Clean your bathroom with mold-killing products, such as bleach, vinegar, and hydrogen peroxide.
- Open windows and doors while cleaning to provide fresh air and help dry out the mold.

If you have a problem area bigger than 10 square feet, refer to guidelines from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency or call in a professional.

"When you see it creeping into walls and insulation, you need a professional," says Cinelli, who notes that tearing out walls (which may be necessary for a big problem) can release mold spores into the rest of

> the house and create an even bigger issue.

"The idea is to kill it and then remove it," he says. "And the most important thing is to figure out why you have it before you clean it up."
