

SEASON PREVIEW ISSUE:

The Swami looks at 2024.

et's face it. The H1 unlimited hydroplane series is facing some serious challenges. The boat count is low, the races are few even with the return of Bayfair in San Diego, and season sponsors are hard to come by. Teams are up for sale and several boats are apparently sitting this one out. The Gold Cup has no named site as we go to press after Detroit decided to drop out for 2024. Tri-Cities, Seattle, or San Diego seem to be the options.

But with all that seemingly going against it the sport has some real positives going for it. At the top of that list is competition. There are four boats that can legitimately be called title contenders out of the expected six, maybe eight boats that will appear this year. The five races that will be staged all appear to be solid and Detroit is expected to return in 2025. That has the potential to jump start owners and sponsors that are sitting on the sidelines.

Spring testing takes place in Tri-Cities on May 31 with the five-race season starting in Guntersville, Ala., with the Guntersville Hydrofest on June 29–30. Although having just staged five races, this site is seeing excellent growth. From there the teams make their traditional

return to the Indiana town of Madison for the Madison Regatta on July 5–7. Then it's the Northwest swing in Washington state with stops in Tri-Cities for the Apollo Columbia Cup on July 26–28 then the Apollo Mechanical Cup in Seattle on August 2–4. This will be the first time Apollo Mechanical has sponsored both these events. After a few weeks off, the final race in will be contested in San Diego on September 13–15.

So, what are the keys taking the title in 2024? Simply put, its consistency. With these few races, and this level of competition, a couple of bad heats, mechanical failures or the dreaded blow over, will knock a team completely out of it. There will be no time for catching up. The team that can run fast and consistent

THE SWAMI SEZ: Not a team to overlook. Often seen as Strong's second boat, it is really just as fast and as well piloted as the supposed number one. Peabody has a way of always being there and stacking up points. Don't forget he won two of the four races in 2023. Should win at least a race and don't be shocked if the championship comes his way. This hull will also receive slightly modified graphics.

It is currently third on the list of boats with the most race victories, is in second place for most career heat victories, and has won more national titles than any other boat in history. Its owner, Miss Madison, Inc., has reportedly put the hull up for sale and appears to have no plans to race it in 2024. That can change if circumstances change, or especially if a buyer emerges.

LAST SEASON: First at Guntersville and Tri-Cities, and third in Seattle. It had to be withdrawn from competition in Madison due to equipment damage. It was the fastest qualifier at Madison and Tri-Cities and finished second in the national standings.

COMMENTS: At 32 years old, this is the oldest in the fleet. In fact, it holds the record for being the oldest boat to win a race in the sport's history. It also ranks fourth for having the greatest number of heats finished. The boat was extensively rebuilt before the 2023 season after being damaged in an end-over-end flip at Madison in 2022. The boat returned to action with plenty of speed, despite its age. Last year in Guntersville, Corey Peabody set an all-time record for the fastest average speed in a competition heat, a mark of nearly 163 mph, and set a course record with a competition lap of over 164 mph. One could legitimately argue that if it hadn't been for a broken prop strut in Madison, the team probably would have won last season's national championship.

uncommon, and they usually qualify for the final heat. Last season, after using another hull (the former Budweiser T-4 that was rebuilt and reidentified as Hull #2111) for two years, the Raneys returned this boat to competition. At one point midway through the 2023 season, the team had a very narrow lead in the national points race.

Finished eighth in the national points standings. **COMMENTS:** While the boat has been around for five years, it has seen action in only three events during that time. Owner Greg O'Farrell became hooked on hydroplane racing as a youth when Bill Muncey gave him a ride aboard the famous *Thriftway Too* in the late-1950s. It's possible the boat might appear as U-60 *Miss Thriftway* as a tribute to that memory. The Go Fast Turn Left Racing Team is a family affair. O'Farrell's son serves as co-owner and crew chief while his grandson sits in the cockpit. The boat will likely see action only in the Pacific Northwest.

He won seven of those titles in a row (the longest streak in history), won nearly half of the races that he entered (again, the best), and won a total of 345 heats (the most). He last drove a hydro in 2022 and the latest reports say that he will return in 2024. If he does, the 70-year-old Villwock would become the oldest person to ever compete in an unlimited hydroplane race.

Museum boats test Lake Washington.

uring the last several years, H1 boats have had a late spring test day at Tri-Cities in preparation for the coming season, and it is an event area hydro fans look forward to watching. Recently, the Hydroplane and Raceboat Museum has tested some of their vintage boats on Lake Washington during May, and it has drawn several hundred fans to the Stan Sayres pit area.

The museum boats are all powered by World War II aircraft piston engines, which means they produce a noise that broadcaster Jim Hendrick used to describe as, "The sounds of engines of unlimited hydroplanes."

On Tuesday, May 14, four museum boats gathered in Sayres pits. Three boats had round bows and used Allison engines, one had a picklefork bow and a Rolls engine. The Allison boats were the restored 1958 *Miss Bardahl*, the replica *Miss Wahoo* (1957 configuration), and *Notre Dame*, which originally was *Miss Lumberville*. The Rolls boat was the restored *The Squire Shop* of 1979.

Each of the four boats went out for a few laps to ensure everything was run-

ning properly. Then the three Allison boats gave rides to people who had either done significant work on the boats or had purchased a ride. *The Squire Shop* also ran again but was not used for giving rides.

On one run, a different propeller Washington shoreling was tested. When the boat reached a spectators who enjoy speed of 110 mph, it wanted to turn left, and the driver had to get off the throttle. Washington shoreling spectators who enjoy and the driver had to get off the throttle.

The boat made it back to the pits safely.

May weather in Seattle can be warm and sunny, or cool and drizzly. The Hydroplane and Raceboat Museum was lucky with a warm sunny day and good water. The pit area and part of the Lake Washington shoreline was filled with spectators who enjoyed the show.

Race Site News by Chris Tracy



Prelude to the 2024 season.

ome of the biggest unlimited hydroplane race site news has been the involvement of Apollo Mechanical. Last month, I mentioned that Apollo Mechanical had sealed a three-year deal to be the unlimited hydroplane race title sponsor in Tri-Cities.

So how did Tri-Cities get the Apollo sponsorship? Apollo has been a smaller sponsor for 30 years in the Tri-Cities. Water Follies officials had approached Apollo earlier about being the title sponsor for the hydro race, but the company did not bite. Darrell Strong had recommended that Water Follies enlist Steve Lamson to help with a title sponsor search. Lamson has a long record of recruiting sponsors for unlimited boats.

Well, the *Tri-City Herald* hit the streets with an article about the race not having a sponsor and Lamson happened to approach Apollo shortly after that, which helped Lamson close the sponsorship deal. While the newspaper article got the information out about the need for a sponsor, Water Follies also credits Lamson for bringing Apollo on board as the unlimited event title sponsor. It is a three-year deal. Also, Apollo is helping sponsor the testing in the Tri-Cities on May 31. That event will be expanded to include a beer garden and evening concert.

But Apollo's role with unlimiteds expanded since last month. Recently, Seafair announced that Apollo Mechanical will sponsor the unlimited race in Seattle, too! Apollo Mechanical deserves a big thank you from hydro fans.

In Seattle there was more news. Longtime Seafair president and CEO Eric Corning has announced he is leaving in September. Corning has worked with Seafair for 25 years. Corning has not only been a great organizer and promoter of Seafair, but he's also a boat racing fan. He'll be missed. Seafair will soon conduct a search for Corning's replacement.

What's happening at H1?

There is still a fair amount of H1 business that has not been revealed for the upcoming season.

SWX will provide Internet streaming for the testing in Tri-Cities for the race site, but as I write this, H1 has not outlined its streaming plans for 2024. The H1 website has said it will be available and free, but many have commented that the Meyer brothers are no longer listed on the H1 website. They have been responsible for producing the streaming video in the recent past.

One fan told me that he asked an H1 board member directly about the streaming program for the 2024 season and was told announcements would be made on the H1 website.

It's time to start the public relations build up for the 2024 season and time for H1 to make more robust and informative use of their website and social media.

H1 had said that having at least six boats at each event was a priority, and inferred there would be round-robin racing with six boats and definitely no match races. Which boats will be racing on the eastern swing? And what happens if only five boats show or qualify?

With no Detroit race on the schedule, will there be a Gold Cup race this year and, if so, where will it be? There is a widely spread rumor that there might be a change in the starting procedure, but who knows? The racing rules have not

been announced.

Just an observation—almost all information about HydroTown has been scrubbed from the H1 website.

I guess what I am saying is that two weeks before spring testing, hydro fans are largely in the dark about the upcoming season, except that there will be five races. And we assume the four H1 board members who operate boat teams will be racing their five boats this season.

New H1 chair Mike Denslow mentioned at the 2023 H1 Unlimited awards banquet that his goal was to make everyone proud of the sport, so between the time I write this column and when it is published on June 1, I'm hopeful fans will learn a lot more about plans for the 2024 season. Fans are rooting for H1 and for the series to succeed. ❖

Like many race fans, I flipped the TV on last Sunday anxious to watch the Indy 500, one of my biggest passions. The TV had apparently been tuned to our local CBS affiliate the last time it was on, because as the screen came to life, I saw race boats speeding around buoys instead of race cars getting ready at the Brickyard.

I had stumbled upon the E1 Series, now being presented on the CBS Sports Network.

I happen to know the effort that H1 Unlimited has made during the past 20 years trying to get the attention of the television sports networks, hoping one of them might cover the sport. The effort has continued to result in frustration. Those making the effort have heard every excuse imaginable—too expensive to produce, not enough fan interest, no major sponsors, not enough races, and so on

Yet, here was a boat race on one of the major national TV networks!

While the boats look exotic—they are electric powered, cruise above the surface on hydrofoils, and have long

pointy bows—they didn't seem particularly fast. I'm guessing there are speed-boats on most lakes that are faster. The drivers didn't appear all that skilled, either. In one case, a driver lost track of the buoys and cut well inside the course without seeming to be aware.

Yet, they're on national television at a coveted time on Sunday mornings! What gives?

I checked the E Series website and saw immediately what they've got that H1 Unlimited doesn't: Money, connections, celebrity, a reality-show vibe, and environmental cachet.

The website itself is impressive, featuring the latest in design. And, it demonstrates why the E Series is already successful. It has the look and feel of Formula 1. The people involved are straight from the Formula 1 cast of characters. There's talk of transcending traditional racing, the drivers are both men and women, and there are events in Saudi Arabia, Venice, Spain, Geneva, Monaco, Rotterdam, and Hong Kong.

The impression is not an accident.

The series was founded by two men with strong connections to Formula 1 and with proven track records in promoting new sustainable forms of motorsports.

As for celebrity? Look at the team owners: Super Bowl champion Tom Brady, tennis champion Rafael Nadal, music producer Steve Aoki, F1 driver Sergio Perez, top cricket player Virat Kohli, technology entrepreneur Marcelo Claure, pro soccer star Didier Drogba, Grammy-winning singer Marc Anthony, and Oscar-winning actor Will Smith.

We often hear from "experts" on Facebook who claim that it should be easy to get the attention of television networks. Look at how spectacular H1 hydroplanes are, they say, how fast they go, and how skilled the drivers are. Some claim H1 would do better if it had noisy engines again.

H1 hydroplanes are more than three times faster than these silent electric boats, the drivers are far more skilled, and the races are more exciting. But, watching the E Series on CBS, it seems none of that really matters. ❖

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
