"On behalf of the staff and board at I Love A Clean San Diego, I want to extend my heartfelt thanks to the 5,000 volunteers for making our Earth Week event a success," said the nonprofit's Executive Director Steve Morris. "It was a wonderful experience to see so many people back in groups to care for our region's environment."

With some results still coming in, volunteers removed over 74,000 pounds of litter and debris from streets, canyons, parks and the coastline in communities from 75 sites around San Diego County.
