**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF MARBLE,
COLORADO, CONCERNING THE ELECTION AND TERMS OF THE TRUSTEES AND THE
MAYOR, AND TO ALLOW FOR STAGGERED TERMS**

WHEREAS, the Town of Marble, Colorado is a statutory town (hereinafter "Town"); and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance Number 5, Series of 1997, the Board increased the terms of certain positions from two years to four years; and

WHEREAS, the Town continues to wish to provide continuity on the Town Board and to do so by lengthening staggering terms; and

WHEREAS, Colorado Statutes § 31-4-301(5) allows the Town to provide by ordinance for four-year terms for the Mayor and Trustees; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has four Trustees and one Mayor

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF MARBLE, COLORADO, ORDAINS THAT:

1. The number of Town Board members shall remain at four Trustees and one Mayor; and be changed to serve as follows: two Trustees to serve 4-year terms, two Trustees to serve 2-year terms, and one Mayor to serve a 4-year term.
2. At any Town election, all persons shall run at large. The person who obtains the most votes shall be elected to the 4-year term. In the event of a tie, the person to serve for four years shall be selected by lot, the method to be selected by the Mayor.
3. At the next succeeding Town election, April 2002, one Trustee shall be elected to serve a 4-year term and three Trustees shall be elected to serve 2- year terms.
4. At all elections thereafter, three trustees shall be elected (one 4-year term and two 2-year terms) and the Mayor will be elected every four years from 1998.
