Stephanie Rudolph Klopper is a senior high school and college educator with more than 40 years of teaching, critical evaluation and course development experience. As the Manager for the Statewide Independent Living and Technology Services programs, she provided adaptive technology solutions to assist persons with disabilities to fully integrate into their communities. After retiring from the state, Joyce worked as Project Manager designing case management software for multiple state agencies.

Joyce and her husband Nick enjoy traveling, especially car trips through the UK, and hope to do so again in the future. Joyce most enjoys being a Grandma to her three grandchildren: Ella, 16; Matthew, 13; and Brooke, 9.

Barbara Stern

Barbara moved to Scottsdale in July, 2013 after a career first as a high school social studies teacher in North Kingstown, Rhode Island and then in Buffalo, NY. Moving to Richmond in 1975 she started her family and co-owned a tutoring service focused on SAT Verbal preparation. After relocating to Kentucky in 1979, she worked as an adjunct instructor at the University of Louisville. It was there that she earned a Master's degree in

Higher Education and College Administration. Upon moving to Orlando, FL in 1981, she resumed her high school teaching. After 12 years, Barbara returned to student status, earning a Doctorate in Curriculum and Instruction at the University of Central Florida (1995). Barbara always tells her students she was on the degree a decade plan (1971, 1984, 1995), a not uncommon trajectory for both women and teachers.

She began her career as a teacher educator at Randolph Macon Woman's College in Lynchburg, VA before moving to James Madison University, Harrisonburg, VA in 1998. Over 15 years at JMU, she advanced from Assistant to Associate and then became a Full Professor, retiring with Emerita status. Along the way, she wrote and co-wrote numerous journal articles and book chapters. She served for 3 years as Associate Editor and 6 years as Editor of *Curriculum and Teaching Dialogue*, the journal of the American Association of Teaching and Curriculum. Barbara has published two books (one edited) on social studies education. She currently teaches a required graduate level course in "Curriculum Theory and Issues" for James Madison University.

A Life Member of BNC, courtesy of her late mother, Minna Slater, she served as President of the Fort Lauderdale chapter in 1983. Barbara has served on the Phoenix Board in a variety of capacities including: Co-VP of Programming, Co-Chair of the Book & Author event Author Committee, Co-Chair of the B&A Event and Parliamentarian. She is currently Co-VP of Study Groups, along with Joyce Steinberg and Stephanie Klopper.

She lives in Scottsdale with her husband Mark. They have two sons, Ben and Jeff. Jeff is married to Sara and they have two children, Micah and Owen.

As news of the passing of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg spread on the eve of Rosh Hashana, the Jewish New Year, a common question heard in discussions among American Jews was: "When will she be buried?"

As a longtime scholar of American Jewish life, I understood that the question behind that question was whether, in death, Justice Ginsburg's family would comply with longstanding Jewish tradition that mandates prompt burial. Or, in accordance with longstanding American tradition, would her burial be delayed so that mourners might pay her respects?

In death, as in life, American Jews looked to see how Justice Ginsburg balanced being an American and being a Jew.



Honoring Our History

In a democracy, "we, the people" have a voice. On November 3rd, across the United States of America, American citizens will have the opportunity to take part in the National election and cast a vote.

This month the **Honoring Our History** Chairs are highlighting the <u>Helmut Hirsch Collection</u>. This Collection was selected because it illustrates the need to take a stand for what we believe to be honest and true, so that one can say "I was not silent" when witnessing injustices.

The personal papers of Helmut Hirsch, a German Jew - technically an American citizen - was a member of the anti-Nazi organization, the Black Front, which plotted to bomb the Nazi headquarters at Nuremberg. Hirsch was to carry out the plot, which was intercepted by the Nazis; he was arrested, tried for treason in secret and executed by the Nazis in 1937, at the age of 21.


In the few months of his internment, Hirsch came to terms with his life, his decisions and his death. He left behind a rich collection of artistic and idealist materials: correspondence with his parents and sweetheart, diaries, notebooks, artwork, poetry, short stories and other writings, as well as photographic scrapbooks that enabled him to express his search for identity as a Jewish youth in Germany.

These materials were donated to Brandeis by his sister, Katie Hirsch Sugarman, because she was eager to see her brother's legacy enlivened for posterity. Interest in the Hirsch case reemerged in recent years and a documentary about him was shown on German television several years ago.

The collection will be digitized at the Brandeis Library for research scholars, students and also for future generations to see and learn about not being silent observers.

The past is history.... what we do with it is our future.




