Meeting called to order at 7:01 P M. via Zoom internet platform.

Attendance: Board Members present: President -Jerome Bokelmann, Vice President - Marc Rude, Junior Board – Scott Huberty, Treasurer - Doug Portlance, Secretary - Mark Leder. Members present: Jerry Schilling, Blair Bolig, Blain Maus, Dale Pomerleau, Steve Barnacle and Mel Eder. Jerome Bokelmann called the meeting to order and conducted the board meeting in accordance with his duties to meet with the board in the monthly scheduled meeting.

Secretary's report: The President asked if there were any corrections or additions to the report for the November printed copy of the minutes. A motion was made by Marc Rude to accept the November minutes as printed in the Ahoogah Newsletter in November. The motion was seconded by Doug Portlance and the motion was passed unanimously.

Treasures report:

Doug Portlance presented the treasures report. A paper copy will be retained with the official club notes. During the presentation a few corrections were made after the initial reading of the spreadsheet. Those in attendance accepted the corrections. Unfinished Business: None

New Business:

Officers of the club need to submit MARC and MAFCA membership validation as per rules of each of the clubs. Board members are eligible for reimbursement of dues to one of the national clubs. The reimbursement is valued at the lower cost of membership when comparing the two clubs. Board members are required to have a membership in each club.

New topic: Brought forward by Mark Leder showing club logo badges made from durable material to mount to cars. Another club did this and we got a contact to the manufacturer and cost structure. Those present were asked if this might be what we want to offer members, is there interest? Those present seemed to like the idea and investigation on costs and the possibility of Engraphics Company which is owned by the Portlance family of our club to find out if they would be interested in making them should we decide on this.

New topic: No decision made, just thrown out for discussion. Would there be interest in offering at a very minimal cost a membership category to children of current member who have now moved out of the family home. Suggestion of digital newsletter, no voting rights, ability to come to all events. The thought process is keeping family members connected to club, when they have less family demands or more spare time they may come in as full members, maybe the parent gives them their car as they age out or it becomes an estate item and they want to keep the car and need support of Model A owners who know about the car and how to keep it running. Good discussion and hope to hear more input in the future.

Topic that surfaces from time to time. Why does the club not seek higher interest investments for the funds we have in the bank? Why not buy a certificate of deposit with a higher yield than our money market? various board members identified that we are a tax-exempt organization and our money market and saving account money does yield interest. Various answers, a CD would create a 1099 form sent to the IRS. That triggers the club filing a tax return. We do not file returns now. Professional service of a CPA to create a return has fees, should we get an inquiry about a return by the IRS we will need to spend additional money on professional services, CPA or perhaps an attorney. Fees would most likely wipe out any or most of any extra interest. Should we have an audit those fees would be much greater. Board members stated they would not want to sign a return on behalf of the club. Board position is not worth the headache of being the one responsible for the return should there be an audit or IRS question. Further comments stated, we are car club that is fortunately well positioned with our treasury, we are here to enjoy and promote our cars, we are not as interested in making the last dollar of interest money as we should be putting our efforts to servicing our members and adhering to our budget. We have lived within our budget, our services, events and club assets owned by this club are very far from lacking.

Mel Eder brought up we should consider donations and scholarships that we have set aside in the budget. We need to look at a donation to Church we use for clinic meetings. Board will have this on our agenda soon.

Mark Leder is concerned about possible event cancelations due to weather, unforeseen circumstances etc. Will run notice in newsletter to look for blast emails before going to event. Will contact members we reach by USPS urging them to find a member with email and ask to be informed if something is emailed – get an email buddy.

Dale Pomerleau brought up idea of winter work meeting – like a coffee social, he will explain this idea at next clinic to those present.

A motion to adjourn was made by Marc Rude, it was seconded by Doug Portlance and the vote was unanimous. Meeting ended at 8:20 P.M. Minutes submitted by Mark Leder, Secretary


December Clinic










Photo Contest for 2023


National Club Affiliation Information
