June Mission Outreach

In-Hospital Ronald McDonald House at Children's Hospital of Richmond at VCU

The facility, run by Ronald McDonald House Charities of Richmond staff and volunteers, serves caregivers and families as their child receives medical treatment in a nearby pediatric unit. All families receiving care through acute inpatient services and the pediatric intensive care unit at Children's Hospital of Richmond at VCU are welcome.

At 3,285 square feet, the In-Hospital Ronald McDonald House provides space for families to relax, enjoy a meal, and participate in calming activities. The family-centered facility offers dining and lounging areas, four Family Sleep Rooms, a food-service area, laundry facilities, a children's play area, and an outdoor patio. Here compassionate RMHC Richmond staff and volunteers present regular programming including Lunches with Love and snack services, warm dinners, and interactive activities such as music, hair styling, and chair massages.

This space features non-clinical architectural design and furnishings to provide a home-away-from-home feel within hospital walls. Our In-Hospital Ronald McDonald House will
