## pastor's letter from Pastor Jane

Dear Friends in Christ,

What **a journey** we all are on! This unusual experience of ours is what might be called "a unique time of God," similar to the World War I experience. Although this unseen enemy is unique to us, unseen enemies are not unique to history. We have been fighting unseen evil for centuries. Paul lived in very troubled times and advised to be "loving" to our neighbor as Jesus advised.

Then Paul defined what that meant in his letter to the troubled Corinthian church in 1 Cor. 13:1-13. His chapter covers the subject of **Love**. In the original <u>Greek</u>, the word <u>ἀγάπη aqape</u> is used throughout the "Ο ύμνος της αγάπης". This is translated into English as "<u>charity</u>" in the <u>King James version</u>. The original text was written in <u>Koine Greek</u>. The "Love Chapter" (used in many weddings) is divided into 13 verses. This chapter of 1 Corinthians is one of many definitional sources for the word *agape* when used to refer to divine love. Introducing his homage to love in <u>1 Corinthians 12:31</u>, Paul describes **agape** love as "a more excellent way". Excellence is a larger scope, it is not a feeling, but a way of acting interacting, speaking and thinking. Seeing excellence in loving ways also helps to know love when we see it, or don't see it. As we continue to search and think through new and meaningful <u>ways to love</u> each other, we are made aware of many ways people <u>do not love or respect</u> each other. You know what these are in your private experiences.

For **example**: The medical community tells me that to wear a mask is an act of love and respect to protect my neighbor, in case I am unknowingly carrying THE virus. The mask does not protect me, as much as it protects those around me.

The **problem** is I hate the mask, it is very uncomfortable, I put it on, it falls off. I put it back on when I see people and take it off when they are gone. Then when someone is here again, I can't find it, and if I find it, I go through the same cycle of struggling keep it in place.

Yet, I know I 'give showers' when I talk; the spittle (and what might be in it) that is the problem. Not only with speaking but in singing, the spray can travel 12 feet! So I see that I should wear a mask and set a good example.

Here is another one of my **excuses**: The mask could muffle my voice when preaching. My voice doesn't need any additional problems! Can I overcome these obstacles for love of my neighbor...for my brothers and sisters in Christ?

If I can, then you can. I'm going to be so glad to see you all, I will do almost anything! This mask is in that "almost anything" category. I hope you see **the humor** of my dilemma, and perhaps can relate to it in your own situation.

And so it is with all these new rules. It is **for the sake of the neighbor** that we follow them. It is the joy of the neighbor that motivates us. This neighbor who is created in God's own image. The God that we love and adore, because He hears us, provides for us and protects us, and redeems us.

With this in mind, our Council will reconvene church (*basilea* in the Greek, from which the word 'basilica' is derived) in the sanctuary beginning June 7. I know some of you will join us from home because of the risks; we love and respect your decision.

For those of us brave enough to come out, we will receive each other joyfully, while loving our neighbor to the best of our ability.

#### **Some things to keep in mind**:

- -Livestream, FB & cable TV services will remain as an option. Come to worship only when you feel comfortable
- -Do not come to worship if you are or feel sick
- -Hold off coming for now if immune system is compromised and/or age warrants that you refrain from attendance.

#### For those in attendance:

- -We strongly encourage the use of masks throughout the service (masks will be provided if you do not have one)
- -Refrain from singing (worship team only will sing and remain masked throughout service)
- -Social distancing required at all times (seats will be set up in this way...6 feet apart)
- -Refrain from handshaking and congregating inside the building and after the service
- -Maximum in the sanctuary (at 25%) is 75. If necessary, there are seating options available the in the overflow/fellowship space (with social distancing)
- -There will be no coffee fellowship time, greeting or passing of the welcome books
- -Offering plates will be in the back of the church (no passing of the offering plates)
- -No children coming forward for children's message or singing/playing at the end
- -Nursery will not be available at this time
- -Water fountain will not be available
- -Two people at a time for the restrooms and one person at a time for the sink.

#### Guidelines for In-person worship services at Hope Lutheran Church – Fosston

- Occupancy We can accommodate a maximum of 100 people (25% Occupancy) in attendance including our Pastor and volunteers, utilizing the main sanctuary, side chapel for seating.
- Weather permitting, doors will be propped open prior to and after the service to minimize the need to touch door handles.
- A Health Screening Survey will be posted at entrances, if you can answer Yes to any of the questions, please refrain from attending the service.
- All people in attendance are strongly encouraged to wear masks for the protection of those around them. Masks will be available.
- We ask that anyone needing to use the elevator limits it's use to one household at a time.
- Seating People attending are to be seated with a minimum of 6 feet of distance on all sides maintained between households
- The Balcony will be closed to general seating for now.
- Offering Plates will not be passed, but left at the back of the church
- Bulletins will be available at the sanctuary entrance or other stations, to be picked up by each attendee.
- Recorded or Special Music will be utilized instead of congregational singing
- If there is Sharing of the Peace, it will be done verbally only, while maintaining 6 feet of social distance
- All items except hymnals and bibles to be removed from pews. Hymnals / Bibles are not be shared between households during a service.
- Communion
  - Individual communion kits to be distributed at stations
  - Persons distributing will wear a mask
  - Hand Sanitize immediately before distribution
  - Ushers to direct in a way that allows for 6 feet of social distance be maintained between households
- Acolytes / Candle lighting
  - Hand sanitize before donning robes.
  - Hand Sanitize before handling candle lighting equipment
  - 6 feet of social distance to be maintained between acolytes, including seating
  - Robes to be placed in a hamper and laundered after each use.
- High Contact areas will be regularly cleaned/sanitized. Cleaning checklist/schedule will be available in the church office.

- 1. Call to Order: Meeting called to order by Evan Fonder President via video conference
- 2. Devotions: Family/Youth/Education Board Michelle read "If you complain, you remain" Remember to not lose sight of what you've been given & keep things in perspective. Thank God for what you have. If one door closes, he will open another.
- 3. Approval of Agenda: Motion to approve, with modifications, by Nancy, second by Travis, Approved Unanimously
- 4. Approval of Secretary's Report: Motion to approve by Greg, second by Tom, Approved Unanimously
- 5. Benevolence Report: Pastor Jane reports that in addition to the usual monthly giving, spending is as follows \$75 for material to make masks, \$68 for preemie and newborn diapers for hospital, \$200 to the food shelf, \$200 to Jennifer Albright (one time gift), & \$100/month support when training begins leaves a balance of \$680 in the emergency fund.

- 7. President's Report: Evan re-echoed a Big Thanks to Pastor Jane, Michelle S., Ryan, Steve and all those who have helped during this uncertain time. We appreciate everyone's flexibility & willingness to adapt.
- 8. Jennifer Albright Mission Presentation: She will be going on a 16 month global internship to Slovania to do ministry & understand their mission. She is needing to raise \$10,000 cost plus \$1,300 additional support per month. Trustees will inquire as to the potential donation from the Marilyn M. fund. No action taken at this time.
- 9. Brief Committee Reports
  - 9.1 Deacons: Dean states they have nothing new to report at this time.
  - 9.2 Family/Youth/Education: Michelle O reports they have been busy. A caravan was organized for the 6 seniors on Sunday, May 10th. Seniors were given a cake & quilt. F/Y/E board hosted a scavenger hunt via zoom for the youth; they have a couple more events planned for May; received \$230.35 in Palubicki's receipts; teacher appreciation will be held on Sunday, May 17th; a new Sunday School curriculum will be ordered; Don Brinkman would like to do a recording for the seniors on the radio the F/Y/E board will pay for it; and graduate boxes are on hold at this time.
  - 9.3 Music & Worship: Nancy reports they are continuing to support Pastor Jane in any way necessary. She also reported on the Garden Valley television issues during church broadcasts.
  - 9.4 Trustees: Tim reports that online giving is up & financials look good. They will move ahead with the Heritage Room remodel (paint, carpet, window trim); A/V system still need a few funds to pay this off; Ryan was given a raise \$100/service; church now has accounts at FNB & American Federal.
