PRESIDENT'S LETTER,



Early Ignition Systems

The early days of engines in the 1800's saw a lot of inventions and many are recorded with the U.S. Patent office, such as these early ignition designs by Frank E. Tremfer in 1893. The images illustrate three designs he produced for ignition inside the piston chamber with a bolt attached to the center of the piston head and a piece of thin metal. Two electrodes protruded into the chamber and when the parts touched, they created the needed ignition. These three designs are very interesting.

Some historians report that the first spark plugs were developed for the combustion engine in around 1860 by Étienne Lenoir, the man credited for its invention.

Early patents for spark plugs included those by Nikola Tesla (in U.S. Patent office for an ignition timing system, 1898), Frederick Richard Simms and Robert Bosch. All producing their own designs. In the early 1900s, a Frenchman named Albert Champion immigrated to the United States in 1889. As a sideline, Champion manufactured and sold spark plugs to support himself. In 1904, Champion moved to Flint, Michigan where he started the Champion Ignition Company for the manufacturing of spark plugs. Robert Bosch. trained in the United States, with Thomas A. Edison and the germen electrical engineer Siegmund Bergmann, and along with his coworker G. Honold, invented the Bosch spark plug in 1902.




