Controlling the Price of Prescriptions

Along with other Council Members, the Assemblyman was updated on state funded economic development projects in our region which includes the following counties: Onondaga, Oswego, Madison, Cortland and Cayuga. This year is the 8th year in which funding for this statewide initiative has been included in the New York State Budget. \$750 million in grant funds and tax credits is available for projects throughout the State.

Honoring Syracuse's Northeast Community Center

Assemblyman Magnarelli (129th District) presents a NYS Assembly resolution to Syracuse Northeast Community Center Executive Director Michael Collins, to mark the center's 40th Anniversary. In 1978, the North East Hawley Development Association (NEHDA) and other community advocates pushed for more community centered services to be located in Syracuse's Northeast Neighborhood, which lead to the eventual establishment of Dr. Weeks Elementary School and the adjoining Syracuse Northeast Community Center. This partnership between the Syracuse Northeast Community Center and Dr. Weeks Elementary School was a unique concept and was the first of its kind in New York State. This community based model, as represented by the Center and the School, has provided many social services throughout the past forty years, including youth development, senior support, family stabilization, health and education, and access to community connections.
