I want to Thank the Granges and members that supported the Keystone Military Families at the March Pomona meeting. We donated 95 pounds of items and \$210 to them. They appreciated what we did to help the families of veterans.

They are a Christian non-profit that fills laundry baskets full of household necessities and provides them for individuals that are starting over after abuse. Along with these necessities, they include a Bible in each basket that has a personal handwritten message and highlighted verses. They pray that along with helping ease the financial burden of starting over, these individuals can also find hope in Jesus. Our hope is that every individual who receives a basket will feel Encouraged, Empowered, and Uplifted once again!

### **AGRICULTURE REPORT** by Doug Sattazahn

You may not realize that much of Eastern Pennsylvania is still in prolonged drought. Dry conditions from less than normal precipitation started developing two years ago. Factors like stream flow, groundwater levels, rainfall and soil moisture are measured by the state to determine what counties are under warnings. A drought watch is the first level of these designations. One county is at the next level, drought warning. Yes, you guessed it, Berks. Residents on drought warning are encouraged to reduce their individual water use by 10 to 15 percent, or a reduction of six to nine gallons of water per day.

With the planting season upon us, farmers are again facing a spring where moisture seems hard to come by. Some strategies to deal with dry soil are planting deeper to find moisture and keeping fertilizers that rob moisture from the seed out of the seed furrow. Still, the dry trend will be a challenge for anyone in our area that is trying to grow something. To assist affected agricultural producers, the USDA has issued emergency loan programs for counties designated as natural disaster areas. These loans can help cover costs such as replacing essential equipment or livestock. Additionally, the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) is offering Economic Injury Disaster Loans to small businesses that have suffered financial losses due to the drought.
