ISRAEL'S NATIONAL ANTHEM HaTikvah



(THE HOPE)



The words to Israel's National Anthem were written in 1886 by Naphtali Herz Imber, a poet originally from the Ukraine. The melody was written by Samuel Cohen, an immigrant from Moldavia. Cohen based the melody on a musical theme found in Bedrich Smetana's 'Moldau'.

It served as the Anthem of the Zionist Movement at the 18th Zionist Congress in 1933. When the State of Israel was established in May 14, 1948, the first stanza and refrain were adopted as the National Anthem. Until 2004, Hatikva was not officially the National Anthem when it was rooted in the Flag and Emblem Law.
