During retirement he built a suite of miniature - sized homes, craft shops and more to depict various real-life buildings in the Colonies. His wonderfully inventive work delights all ages.

Exhibits show Amana industrial design, the inventiveness and creativity of Amana textile design and landscapes by 20th century Amana colony painters.
