It would appear from feedback we have received that focussing on a country as the theme for this event is very popular – indeed, we have received suggestions already of countries for next year. The date for next year's event has been fixed as Saturday  $18^{\rm th}$  July. In the past we have varied the month, but this weekend, falling as it does at the end of the school year/beginning of the school holidays, seemed to cause difficulties for the fewest members.



This year we requested donations of period products. Once again, we witnessed members' generosity, and we will be able to deliver sizeable contributions to refuges in our region. Thank you to all individuals and WIs who contributed; based on last year's reactions, we are sure they will be very gratefully received.

There have been a couple of queries regarding NFWI's dental health washbags crafting project, details of which appeared in the July/August edition of WI Life magazine (page 45). The intention is for either individuals or WIs to create toilet bags for dental care essentials and to take these to local foodbanks, hygiene banks, shelters, and women's refuges in order to address the reduction in the amount of these products being received due to their cost. There is no central collection for the finished washbags, and it is up to individuals to decide where they would like to donate them. Unfortunately, the WI Hub is not able to collect them, but food and hygiene banks often have collection points in larger local supermarkets for your convenience.

Crafting, contributing to the community and support for women are well-known attributes of WI members, but following this year's International Day, the skill of haiku writing can be added to the list, at least in South Yorkshire Federation! As with all online ticket platforms there will be an unavoidable booking fee which is 20p + 6% of the ticket price. (i.e. if the ticket is £1 you will pay £1.26 at the checkout.) We have carefully looked at all online ticket platforms and TICKETLAB seems to provide the most cost effective option.

Should an event have to be cancelled you will receive a refund but **the booking fee is NOT refundable.**

## Act Now, Change Forever Mass Lobby of Parliament

On 9<sup>th</sup> July, I took part in the mass lobby of Parliament organised by the Climate Coalition. Below is a picture of some of the 5000 people of all ages and backgrounds who came together on the day to call on the government to take action on climate and nature. You can see representatives of the WI holding up placards towards the back.

My MP, Lee Pitcher (Doncaster East and the Isle of Axholme), agreed to meet me in his office in Portcullis House. I was feeling a bit nervous as I queued to go through the strict security check before being allowed into the building but I'd prepared by joining an NFWI zoom meeting and had all my notes ready. I was welcomed by one of his team and taken up to the office. After friendly introductions, I explained my concerns about the climate and nature crises and the lack of urgent government action to tackle these problems. My three main asks were:

- Cut bills, back UK jobs and secure a greener fairer future for all
- Restore nature to create a safer, healthier environment
- Deliver vital funding to communities hardest hit by climate change here and around the world

Mr Pitcher listened carefully and we had a good discussion. With his background in working in the water industry, he was sympathetic to the issues raised and explained the government's plans for the future. We talked for about an hour and before I left, I gave him a knitted green heart and showed him my climate scarf – he actually asked if I could knit one for him! After the meeting, I went to the Queen Elizabeth II Conference Centre, near the Houses of Parliament, where there were talks to listen to and lots of stalls run by organisations which are members of the Climate Coalition, such as RSPB, WaterAid, Natonal Trust, Christian Aid and, of course, the WI.

It was very inspiring to meet and talk to so many different people who'd all come together with the same aim – to show how much they care about climate and nature. I came away feeling that I had made my voice heard and also feeling more hopeful about the future.
