

The Congregational Meeting is necessary to authorize the expense budget for the coming year and to elect Vestry members, who serve three (3) year terms.




Who can vote at the Congregational Meeting?

## Augustus' Women of the ELCA THANKOFFERING/ Quilt & Afghan Sunday



Augustus' Thankoffering/Quilt & Afghan Sunday will be held on November 23, 2025, at both the 8:00am & 10:30am church worship services. Amanda Bryant, Director of Donor & Volunteer Engagement at Gemma Services, will be our guest speaker. With nearly 20 years of experience in the nonprofit sector, and 11 years with Gemma, Amanda oversees donations of in-kind items (such as clothing and toys), including coordinating the organization's annual Christmas gift collection which Augustus supports. She also coordinates Gemma's volunteer program, special events, and donor stewardship - making sure Gemma communicates to our supporters, such as many faithful congregational friends, the impact of their charitable giving to Gemma.

Gemma Services was formed in 2019 by the merger of two long-standing Philadelphiaarea non- profits: Silver Springs - Martin Luther School and the Village. Both legacy organizations were founded in the 1800s as orphanages and evolved through the years to respond to the growing needs in our local communities. Today, as one organization, Gemma assists youth and families through challenging times. Guided by the vision of a world where every person knows they matter, Gemma Services' mission is to accompany people of all ages through life's challenges using individualized, datainformed support. With three locations in Greater Philadelphia, more than 3,000 youth and families participate each year in Gemma's 10 mental health, child welfare, and prevention programs, and special education school (Martin Luther School).

You won't want to miss this service!! Following the services refreshments will be served in the Muhlenberg Center.

Also, on this day handcrafted quilts and afghans by Augustus' Women of the ELCA Hearts & Hands Committee will be on display. The quilts and afghans were produced under the direction of Mildred Stuffle. The quilts will be given to Lutheran World Relief for distribution to the less fortunate in countries all over the world. The full-sized afghans will be taken to Laurel House, a shelter for abused women and children, in Norristown, and the baby afghans will be taken to the St James Outreach House in Collegeville. The prayer blankets will be given to Doylestown Hospital for end-of-life patients. Producing and distributing quilts and afgahns to those in need is a tangible way to express love to our neighbors in need.

In honor of Thankoffering, envelopes will be distributed for your donation which support the life-changing ministries of Women of the ELCA by covering the costs for programs, resources, leadership training, and operational expenses. All the money collected will be sent directly to the churchwide organization of the Women of the ELCA. Make checks payable to "Augustus Women of the ELCA". Please be generous! Thankofferings show gratitude for God's blessings and hope for all that is to come. They give us an important and tangible way to express that gratitude and hope. # Graceful Generosity

Published to help you grow as a steward of God's grace.

Stewardship begins with gratitude ... gratitude for who we are in Christ, gratitude for the salvation he has won for us on the Cross, and gratitude for who he is and all his gifts to us. As stewards, we recognize that we are completely dependent on God for all we have and need and that, as we offer thanks for God's gifts, we also strive to use them in ways that please him.

#### Testing your knowledge of Scripture

Can you identify who from Scripture is in the Sycamore tree?



If you said Zacchaeus, you were right. Do you remember how Jesus changed his life and his attitude toward his wealth (Luke 19:1-9)? Prior to meeting Jesus and experiencing Jesus' love and the forgiveness of his sins, he lived for his money. After Jesus changed his heart, Zacchaeus lived to please the Lord. This was demonstrated when he gave away half of what he owned to the poor and four times the amount to those he had cheated. Are you handling your resources in such a way as to reflect a relationship with Jesus?

#### **Does God Need Stewards?**

As stewards, we acknowledge God as the creator and owner of all things. What God has entrusted to us, we are to manage for him according to God's purpose. Because we are merely caretakers of God's property, we, through our giving, are simply returning to God what he has already given to us. The Psalmist wrote, "... every animal of the forest is [his] and the cattle on a thousand hills" (Psalm 50:10). With God's vast resources, God does not need our offerings. "I have no need of a bull from your stall or of goats from your pens" (Psalm 50:9).

Neither are we sharing "our" talents. Those, too, are gifts from God. The most eloquent preacher cannot work faith in the heart of the believer (1 Corinthians 12:3). The most skilled doctor cannot heal (Psalm 103:3). Each believer possesses at least one gift to be used serving others, but these gifts "he has received" (1 Peter 4:10) from God's gracious hand.

Does God need our gifts to accomplish his will? Did He need Moses' staff to part the Red Sea or Joshua's army to fell Jericho? Hardly! Does God need the preacher or teacher to impart his Word or the researcher to find a cure for cancer? Not really. "For the foolishness of God is wiser than man's wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than man's strength" (1 Corinthians 1:25).

Even time is something over which we have no control. "My times are in your hands" (Psalm 31:15). We cannot choose the time of our births or our deaths (Hebrews 9:27). James tells us that all our plans are boasting and bragging. He wrote, "Instead you ought to say, 'If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that'" (James 4:14-16).

God is not bound by time. "For a thousand years in your sight are like a day that has just gone by, or like a watch in the night" (Psalm 90:4).

No, God does not need our money, our gifts, or our time. However, we are privileged to be chosen by God to be his stewards. God has called us to give of "our" resources, "our" money, gifts, and time.

He calls us to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, provide hospitality to the stranger, clothe the needy, and care for the prisoner (Matthew 25:38-40). We are to comfort as we have been comforted (Luke 11:4).

Let us, as stewards in this age, humbly consider the privilege God has given us by calling us to serve others with his gifts.



#### Being Stewards of God's Light

As God changes night into day, so he brings us out of spiritual darkness into his light. "You, O Lord, keep my lamp burning; my God turns my darkness into light" (Psalm 18:28).

As God's redeemed people, we find courage in the words of Psalm 27:1, "The Lord is my light and my salvation - whom shall I fear?" God's light outshines all other light: His light guides us, his light protects us, and his light saves us.

Being a light means more than going to church. It means more than busyness in church work. Being a light means to share Jesus so others will come to know Christ as the way, the truth, and the life.

#### A Stewardship Illustration

A pig and a hen were strolling amicably down the street when they saw a sign in a lunchroom window reading:

#### DELICIOUS HAM AND EGGS.

"Isn't it grand," said the hen, "that together we can give human beings something that delights them?"

The pig frowned, "Yes," he said, "but you're giving out of surplus; for me, giving is a real sacrifice."



From that point of view, most of us have not reached the point of sacrificial giving. At times God asks us to give until we can truly feel the giving. Giving sacrificially usually includes one of the following:

- **♣** A rearrangement of priorities.
- ♥ A change in lifestyle.
- **♥** A forfeiture of something valued.

#### **OUILTING GROUP**

The Quilting group makes tie quilts for Lutheran World Relief. Quilting meets the first Wednesday and third Tuesday of each month from 9:30 AM to 11:30 AM.



We now have quilting packs available in the Muhlenberg Center. Each pack has instructions, and a contact email address if you have any questions. Each pack has 48 squares in it and makes a 60" X 80" quilt top.

- 1. Pick a pack out of the Basket on the table.
- 2. Sew the squares into a Quilt top.
- 3. Return the pack to the bin under the table.

Each quilt top will then be used to make a quilt for Lutheran World Relief.

#### KNITTING & CROCHET GROUP

Do you like to Knit or Crochet? You don't need any more Afghans or sweaters? The knitting 'n crochet group members work on their own projects or work on one of the projects described below. Knitting 'n Crochet meets the second and fourth Monday of each Month from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM.



The Hearts and Hands Committee of Augustus Women of the ELCA collects knitted and crocheted 7" x 9" inch blocks that are sewn together into Afghans for Laurel House, a shelter in Norristown for abused women and children.

We also collect completed Afghans. The completed full-sized Afghans should about 49" X 56" (about the same size as the top of a double bed). These Afghans are also donated to Laurel House. Baby Afghans should be about 36" X 36" or 36" X 45" in pastel colors. These Afghans are donated to Genesis Pregnancy Care Center in Pottstown.

Doylestown Hospital: Knitted/crocheted/quilted blankets -- 2'-3' wide by 3'-4' long. The blankets will be distributed to end-of-life patients, both hospice and non-hospice. Blue is the most requested color, but any color is okay.

Holy Redeemer Hospital's Maternity Ward: Knitted/crocheted/quilted blankets -- 60" x 50" – Pastel colors. The blankets will be distributed to mothers who lost their babies.



## Making a Difference

Do you find it interesting, as I do, that God has made us different in so many ways? Looking around the church I see that some of us are short, others tall; some us wear glasses, others don't, some of us like sports, some of us like to fish and hunt, others like computers. Some of us like and are good at music while others aren't. God has given us different interests, talents, desires, and gifts. God also gives us different careers. God made us carpenters, business people, doctors, plumbers, teachers, etc. We don't look or sound alike, but as Christians we do have much in common. As God's children, we believe that he has created us and loves us so much that he sent his son to die for each of us. We know that God calls and knows us by name, and we are united in our faith.

As God's people, we also have a common task as Ephesians 4:12 states, "that the body of Christ may be built up." God in his infinite wisdom allows us to choose how to serve him best. As we contemplate how best we can serve the Lord, it is good to remember that God will empower us so we can faithfully use our God-given talents for his kingdom. God didn't make us and give us so much without giving us, as well, the ability to make a difference in our church, community, and the world. God will always equip us for the tasks he gives us to do. Think of the account of the tongue-tied Moses whom God equipped to be the leader of a vast nation. Study the life of David, an obscure shepherd boy, whom God prepared to be king. Ephesians 4:16 reads, "From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work." It is important and essential that we do our parts to support the body of Christ. We could easily compare this to a basketball team, which requires the contribution of each player. 
