## Highlighting Annual Meeting Nov 11, 2017

Administrator, Chris Radel, opened the meeting with familiar words from our Leader, Mary

Baker Eddy: "Love is not something put upon a shelf, to be taken down on rare occasions with sugar-tongs and laid on a rose-leaf. I make strong demands on love, call for active witnesses to prove it...the glorious significance of affection is more than words: it is the tender, unselfish deed done in secret; the silent, ceaseless prayer; the self-forgetful heart that overflows; the veiled form stealing on an errand of mercy, out of a side door; the little feet tripping along the sidewalk; the gentle hand opening the door that turns toward want and woe, sickness and sorrow, and thus lighting the dark places of earth" (Miscellaneous Writings 1883-1896, p. 250). Surely, Chris said, this is Christian Science nursing in action,

and we know you will catch glimpses of this love in today's reports and in the talk from our guest speaker, Kate Robertson, C.S.

**Board President, Joy Mee,** expressed the Board's gratitude for Mrs. Eddy's establishment of Christian Science nurses and for the Christian Science Board of Directors' continuing support of Christian Science nursing. This support is evidenced through their establishment of the Benevolent Association, the first Christian Science nursing facility in 1916, and their continuing help through the Christian Science Nursing Activities Department, which is a liaison from the Board to the Christian Science nursing field.

Gratitude was expressed for an increase in nurses to our staff lists, hosting the AOCSN conference and dinner, completion of our first capital project with costs fully covered by donations from donors in response to the need made known, use of the National Fund for Christian Science Nursing for a patient, enhanced credentials for a staff member, and the ability to respond to an unusual demand for a heavy nursing load for a short time.

She mentioned that although Christian Science nursing in Arizona has evolved over time from El Dorado Vista, a larger facility in Phoenix, to the current three bed facility, Desert View Christian Science Care in Scottsdale, its mission is the same—to provide practical care to support healing through the practice of Christian Science.

As your Board plans for the next 5 to 15 years, she stressed that we need your help in identifying the future need for Christian Science care, either for skilled nursing or support for assisted living. Arizona and the Southwest are continuing to grow faster than other areas of the country. How can we serve you, your family and friends better now or in the future?

Vice President, Derek Swire, paved the way for the Treasurer's report saying, while the financial report we present is an expression of where we humanly stand financially, it is important because it will tell you where we stand in our demonstration of God's infinite provision for all our needs.

While the report is given in a human, nuts and bolts format, we want you to know that your Board and Staff at Desert View are constantly working from a metaphysical standpoint and watching that be expressed in a way of human understanding.

Hymn 182 in our Christian Science Humnal starts "Make channels for the streams of Love,/where they may broadly run." We at Desert View are working to do that; make new and broader channels for God's love. We endeavor

to be able to take care of the human need for everyone that needs our help, both at Desert View and at home. So we pray that there will always be a bed and a nurse available or an alternative to meet the need. We are working to provide visiting nurse service and expand its availability. We pray to be able to provide financial benevolence to those who need it. We work to make our structure even more comfortable and homelike.

The second part of the first verse of Hymn 182 states, "And Love has overflowing streams,/to fill them every one." We see Love's flowing streams in patients' payments of gratitude, the donations of churches and Christian Scientists all over the state, and the receipt of grants. We see it in the establishment of foundations and charities meeting the needs of nurses and nursing care. And we are grateful!

The second verse of Hymn 182 states, "But if at any time we cease/such channels to provide,/ The very founts of love for us/will then seem parched and dried." Therefore, we listen daily for direction from God on how to provide new channels and widen the ones already established. This is a pleasure, not a chore, for your Board and Staff, and a privilege for us to share.

**Treasurer, Don Johnson,** has provided some updated comments to his report at Annual Meeting. Though the year 2017 was a good year for healing care at the Desert View facility, the year was financially challenging since patient days and revenue were over 20% less than typical. We had forecasted at the Annual Meeting a 28% income to expense shortfall for the year. There was a wonderful demonstration of increased financial support during the fourth quarter through contributions from individuals, churches, Christian Science organizations, plus a significant contribution from a church that closed. Our resulting 2017 income to expense shortfall was only 5%.

This loving support shows that Desert View is truly Arizona Christian Scientists' gift to our state-wide community. And beyond. Thanks to all for both your spiritual and financial support.

As the Board contact for our church "reps," I want to express my joy and gratitude for having had the opportunity to speak with some of you who were at the meeting.
