## Sunday Reflection: Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

John's title for Jesus—"the Lamb of God"—reveals Christ's mission as the One who redeems humanity from sin. Just as the blood of the Passover Lamb delivered Israel from slavery and death (Exodus 12), Jesus freely offered His life on the cross as the perfect sacrifice for our salvation (1 Corinthians 5:7). His outpoured blood cleanses and heals us, breaking the power of sin and freeing us from the ultimate consequence of sin, which is death (Romans 6:23) and spiritual destruction (Matthew 10:28). It is significant that John, the son of Zechariah—a priest who offered the daily lamb in the Temple for the sins of the people (Exodus 29)—recognized in Jesus the true and unblemished Lamb sent by the Father. In Christ, John saw the one sacrifice capable of cancelling the debt of sin and delivering humanity from death.

When John says he "did not know" Jesus (John 1:31, 33), he refers to the hidden mystery of Jesus' divinity. At the appointed moment, the Holy Spirit revealed Christ's true identity, enabling John to proclaim Him as the Son of God. Our certainty that Jesus is indeed the Christ also comes through this same Spirit, who grants us the gift of faith, opens our hearts to God's saving plan, and leads us toward deeper understanding and love (Ephesians 1:10). If we desire to grow in the knowledge and love of Christ, we need only ask the Lord to pour out His Holy Spirit upon us, strengthening our faith, hope, and love, and guiding us according to His divine purpose.

### Saint of the Week... St. Sebastian

St. Sebastian was an early Christian saint popularized by Renaissance painters and believed to have been martyred during the persecution of Christians by the Roman emperor Diocletian.

According to his legend, he was born in Gaul, went to Rome, and in 283 joined the army of the emperor Carinus, later becoming a captain under Diocletian. When it was discovered that he was a Christian who had converted many soldiers, Sebastian was ordered to be killed by arrows. The archers left him for dead, but a Christian widow nursed him back to health. He then presented himself before Diocletian, who condemned him to death by beating. His body, thrown into a sewer, was found by another pious woman, who dreamed that Sebastian told her to bury his remains near the catacombs. His relics are believed to be in the Basilica of San Sebastiano on the Appian Way.

St. Sebastian's martyrdom was a favorite subject of Renaissance artists, and he is usually shown as a handsome youth pierced by arrows. He is the patron saint of archers and athletes.




Beginning next month we will be sharing here the members of our parish family who are celebrating a birthday the coming week (dates only, no years!).
