First Reading: Isaiah 40.21-31 (New Revised Standard Edition)

- ²¹ Have you not known? Have you not heard?
 Has it not been told you from the beginning?
 Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth?
- ²² It is he who sits above the circle of the earth, and its inhabitants are like grasshoppers; who stretches out the heavens like a curtain,
- and spreads them like a tent to live in;
- ²³ who brings princes to naught, and makes the rulers of the earth as nothing.
- ²⁴ Scarcely are they planted, scarcely sown, scarcely has their stem taken root in the earth,
- when he blows upon them, and they wither, and the tempest carries them off like stubble.
- ²⁵ To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One.
- ²⁶ Lift up your eyes on high and see: Who created these?

Gospel: Mark 1.29-39 (New Revised Standard Edition)

²⁹ As soon as they^[a] left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. ³⁰ Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. ³¹ He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

³² That evening, at sunset, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed with demons. ³³ And the whole city was gathered around the door. ³⁴ And he cured many who were sick with various diseases and cast out many demons; and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

³⁵In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. ³⁶ And Simon and his companions hunted for him. ³⁷ When they found him, they said to him, "Everyone is searching for you." ³⁸ He answered, "Let us go on to the neighboring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do." ³⁹ And he went throughout Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons.
