

AT FEATHER LAKE

Feather Lake remains dry and closed to public use. It last saw water in early October. The last time it held water for a full month was August 2010. The adjacent Feather Lake II basin is also dry, due to extensive groundwater pumping last year, followed by only partial recovery of the water table from the resulting drawdown. With little river water available for irrigation, we can expect extensive groundwater pumping again in 2013...and another tough year for cottonwoods and willows at Feather Lake.

Our next workday at Feather Lake takes place **Sat.**, **February 9** starting at **9 a.m.** We'll continue the endless process of removing trash from the basin and clear downed tree limbs now blocking the trail on the inner berm within the basin. Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.



Audubon at RIO BOSQUE WETLANDS PARK

For the past 10 years, water deliveries to Rio Bosque have ended in



mid-to-late winter (last year, January 29) and, for the most part, not resumed until fall, after the irrigation season ends. This year, deliveries are expected to be reduced but not totally eliminated. For up-to-date information on water conditions and the park's birds, check www.riobosque.org. Riparian Restoration Workshop February 26, 2013

Please join Greg Fenchel and Keith White from the Los Lunas Plant Materials Center as they present restoration techniques for areas recently affected by woody plant invasives removal and/or treatments.

Bosque Del Apache Saturday and Sunday, December 15 &16, 2012

We birded the Bosque on Saturday, where we saw lots of raptors, including **Bald Eagles, Ferruginous Hawk, Red-tailed Hawks** and an **Aplomado Falcon,** plus lots



of Sandhill Cranes and Snow and Ross's geese, as well as a wide variety of ducks. We also had Northern Shrike, Horned Larks and American Pipits.

Saturday evening we had a nice group dinner at Socorro Springs. On the way to the fly-out on Sunday morning, we saw a **Great Horned Owl**. We then went up to Water Canyon, which had a light dusting of snow. There we had **Canyon**



Towhees, White-breasted Nuthatch, Acorn Woodpecker and lots of meadowlarks.

On the way back to El Paso, we stopped at the El Camino Real International Heritage Center State Monument, which is in the middle of nowhere, but well worth a visit.

Field Trips

Saturday, February 23, 2013 Hollomon Lakes and Dog Canyon

We'll drive north on US54 about 1-1/2 hours to Alamogordo, then US70 to the Holloman Lakes. Holloman Lakes is an Important Bird Area where we will look for shore birds, waterfowl, gulls and raptors.



Afterward, we will picnic and bird at Oliver Lee State Park. There is a fee of \$5 per vehicle. After lunch we'll take a short hike up Dog Canyon.

Saturday, March 9, 2013 Reservoirs Down the Valley



We'll be traveling down I-10 East to visit the reservoirs of McNary, Ft. Hancock and Tornillo. We will also make a stop

at the Ft. Hancock water treatment ponds. Possible sightings will be Western & Clark's grebes, Eared Grebes, pelicans, gulls, egrets, sandpipers, cormorants, herons and ducks of many species.
