<u>Chalk Rule</u> – I talked with John Jalonski, league operator from our sister league (SECPL) about the chalk rule which came up recently.

John provided a very good description and found the video that I was looking for. The You Tube video provides a great demonstration of a what a double hit foul looks like and how to avoid it.

Whenever the cueball and the object ball are within a chalk's width or closer to each other the possibility of a double hit is likely. Below is the description that John provided with a link to the video.

Notes from week Fifteen

Double Hit in Pool

After talking and observing many of our league's players, it has become obvious that many are not aware of what is, or how to determine a double hit. This is my attempt to explain and how to determine if a shot is a double hit. Hopefully, this will make players, especially new and inexperienced, to be a believer.

Definition of a Double Hit: a double hit occurs when the cue tip, or side of the stick comes in contact with the cue ball a 2nd time in the same shot.

This happens too fast to be seen with the naked eye. Basically, if the cue ball follows the object ball more than ½ a ball diameter, it is a double hit foul.

Two scenarios came up this week pertaining to fouls.

- 1. A player accidently touched a moving object ball with their cue stick while executing a shot. That is a foul resulting in a ball in hand for their opponent. What is to be done with said object ball? The ball is left where it comes to rest. If it was knocked off the table or into a pocket the ball shall be spotted back on the table.
- A player asked about the "Chalk Rule" and how to properly hit the cue ball when it is within a chalk width of the object ball? The Chalk Rule can be found on the website in the "Official IBL Rulebook for Thursday Night 8-ball" under rule 8.10 Double Hit (Chalk Rule).

8.10 Double Hit (Chalk Rule)

If the cue tip strikes the cue ball twice on the same stroke, it is a ball in hand foul. To avoid a double hit the cue ball must be struck at a minimum of a 45° angle whenever riskily close (a chalk width or closer) to the intended object ball. If the player decides to shoot the cue ball straight ahead at the object ball the player must elevate the back of their cue stick at least to a 45° angle and shoot downward at the cue ball. In doing so, they must keep the cue ball from moving straight ahead and past the spot of where the object ball was resting prior to the shot. Failure to do so is considered a double hit which is a ball in hand foul.

I had a You Tube video on the website that showed some examples on how to properly execute this shot. It is no longer available. I will see if I can find a similar video to post for future reference.



Last week I was asked what the ruling is when an object ball is knocked off the table.

I gave the wrong information. Thankfully, it did not affect the outcome of the match.

The correct ruling when an object ball is knocked off the table is as follows, SPOT the object ball onto the foot spot or just below any ball(s) that are occupying the foot spot. Knocking an object ball off the table is a foul that results in a ball in hand for the opponent.

This brings up an addition situation. If a shooter accidently uses an object ball as the cue ball it is a ball in hand foul. Additionally, if the shooter sinks one of their own object balls the object ball comes back up and gets placed on the foot spot or just below any ball(s) that are occupying the foot spot.


For this reason, I added a way to see the timeouts history. It shows when each timeout was taken by both teams.



Here are some of the more important changes from voting results

- **Team weekly dues**: Dues have changed from \$50 per week to \$60 per week. This breaks down to \$15.00 per player / per match. Or, \$3.00 per player / per round. This will also add \$2,640 to the total prize money.
- **Timeouts:** There will no longer be two timeouts per round. Instead, each team will get a total of 10 timeouts to use at any time throughout the match. Basically, use them until you lose them.



To take a timeout, tap the T or +.

• **Player handicaps:** Player handicaps will range between 3-8. Prior to this the handicap range was between 2-9. New players coming into the league with no prior handicap or known skill level will start as a 3.5. Male or female.
