## **Biography**

Robert E. Fealko, age 99 of Harbor Beach, passed away on February 27th, 2025 at
Courtney Manor in Bad Axe, MI. He was born on May 29th, 1925, in Harbor Beach to the late Peter and Sarah (Given) Fealko. Robert was a WWII veteran and proudly served his country in the Army Infantry for 2 1/2 years. He served about two years in the Pacific area fighting the Japanese, and the last three months of that time was served in the occupation of Japan. He was involved in retaking
Guam, Leyte, the Kerama Islands and Okinawa. The battle of Okinawa was the 6th bloodiest battle in U. S. history. Robert's work life was quite simple, spending 12 years working for Huron Milling Company and Hercules and 30 years in the Postal
Service, retiring as Postmaster. Robert married Margaret Koglin on September 16, 1950, in Port Hope. She preceded him in death on January 9th, 2020. He was a member of Zion Lutheran Church and enjoyed walking, biking, and their retirement trips to Florida
