## RC 7 Delegates Attend NYSUT ED 51 Meeting

The March 18-19, 2025, ED 51 Meeting in Utica was jam packed with information from NYSUT officers, staff, and guests. Loretta, Candace Johnson, and I attended as your delegates.

The first reports were from the three sub-committees of the Retiree Advisory Council, co-chaired by Beverly Voos (RC 6) and Ron Gross (NYSUT VP). They introduced the three sub-committees and their chairs. Each committee reported on their progress.

The Communication Committee work is ongoing as they are continuing the previous work done by the last RAC which brought about an updating of the NYSUT webpage. The current work involves strengthening communication between in-service and retiree members through electronic, written, and website means. They also wish to review the process of communicating with retirees regarding VOTE-COPE and its importance. They hope to make it easier for retirees to continue from payroll to pension deduction.

The Fix Tier 6 Committee, with the help of NYSUT political action, has seen some progress made which includes changing the right of vesting from 10 years to 5 years and getting the School Boards Association on board this very important cause. The easy part is looking at the inequities, but changes in fixing Tier 6 will take time and be expensive, but it is a high-level topic with politicians. The committee plans to keep this in members' and the public's mind this year.

The Resolution Committee gathered information on the feasibility of implementing resolutions in order to make them successful. In October 2024, the Retiree Recognition resolution was implemented for the first time. It is now part of NYSUT's calendar on an annual basis and will hopefully improve over time as locals become more involved in honoring their retiree councils.

Ron Gross and Carrie Andrews, Program Services Manager, and Jonathan Rubin, Field and Affiliate Services, presented many updates from NYSUT, including the implementation of a committee to examine health insurance across NYS.

So far, this committee has learned that health insurance across NYS is quite a mixed bag that includes PPO/POS, HMO/EPO, HDP/HAS, and Indemnity plans.

Information is going out in every retiree newsletter about opting in for the printed and mailed version of the RC newsletter. Please read the instructions on your last newsletter and let NYSUT know if you wish to opt in to receive a newsletter via US Mail. You have until September 2025 to send in your request. Ron promised one newsletter each year will be mailed to everyone even if opt for electronic. Which one will be mailed is up to each RC. Newsletters are already available online. You can download an electronic version of your NYSUT ID card. Log in to NYSUT.org and find out how.

David Keefe, President of NYS Teacher's Retirement System Trustee Board, spoke to us and said NYSTRS is the safest, most secure fund in the United States. Our 30-year return on our investments has been about 30%.

John Cochran, Chief of Staff from the NYS Office of Aging, presented updates on the work that the office is doing on a state-wide level. We also received updates about NYSUT Member Benefits from Yessenia Raposo.

Lastly, At-Large Director Florence McCue gave a short talk on preparing for the unexpected. Florence said that all retirees should make sure that they have all important papers (Will, Power of Attorney, Health Care Proxy, Living Will, Trust, Insurance Policies, Medical Information, Bank Accounts, Passwords, Financial Documents) all in a single place accessible by the person who will act on your behalf if you become incapacitated. Prepare careful instructions on your doctors' names and phone numbers, your burial and funeral wishes, who needs to be contacted upon your death (insurance, banking institutions, NYSTRS, SSA) and the fact that at least five copies of death certificate will be needed.

As I said in the beginning a very productive and informative meeting. We are all looking forward to representing you at the NYSUT RA in May.
