

Its original configuration lies somewhere between the hall and parlor and massed-plan folk styles (i.e. two bays across the front and one across the rear), but has been expanded upon by a partial roof extension on the west side. 43. History and Significance The 8.3 acres of land on which this house now sits were purchased by Christian Fedderson (aka Fetterson) from Herman Koster (ERI-1530) in 1883. No house was shown at this site on the 1874 Atlas map, so it is very probable that it was built by Fedderson. This is further supported by oral tradition. States from Germany in 1874, settling on K.I. where their first child was born. After building their home they set out an orchard around their house, as well as a large vineyard. Of their children, Rose married Nelson Dwell (ERI-1584), and Mary married their neighbor to the north, Henry Riedy (ERI-1752).

In 1924 the house was purchased by Henry Marchky (ERI-1554) who used it for storage. In recent years it has been used as rental property for summer visitors by the present owner.
