## Westmoreland Inaugurates 1st TV Station In Vietnam

QUI NHON, Sept. 25 (UPI) — Gen William C. Westmoreland, commander of U.S. Force in Vietnam, used a Japanese Samurai sword today to cut a piece of video tape and officially inaugurate the first ground television station in Vietnam.

The station, first of seven semi-mobile stations planned for U.S. Forces in the country, stands atop a 1,560-foot mountain above the gleaming blue waters of Qui Nhon Bay. It will beam entertainment and information to between 5,000 and 10,000 troops.

It is a compact, 5,000-watt station in a military van. The van consists of a complete studio and transmitting facilities, including two film projectors, a slide projector and multiplexer and a full audio and video console.

The one-man studio has two television cameras, one of them portable. Two live five-minute news programs will be broadcast from it.

The other programming, a total of about three hours a day now and expansion to 50 hours a week, will be film or kinescope recordings of popular American television shows, including the Danny Kaye and

Batman. There will be one feature-length film a week.

Commanders could also use it to reach larger numbers of troops in a hurry.

The station will be operated by a 12-man staff, including one officer, from the Armed Forces Radio and Television Service, Capt. Willis J. Haas Jr., of Allentown, Pa., is in charge.

In his remark inaugurating the station, Westmoreland said the station — and the entire network when it is completed sometime next year — will be of great value to the military assistance command, Vietnam, in getting the word to the troops in the field and in providing entertainment.

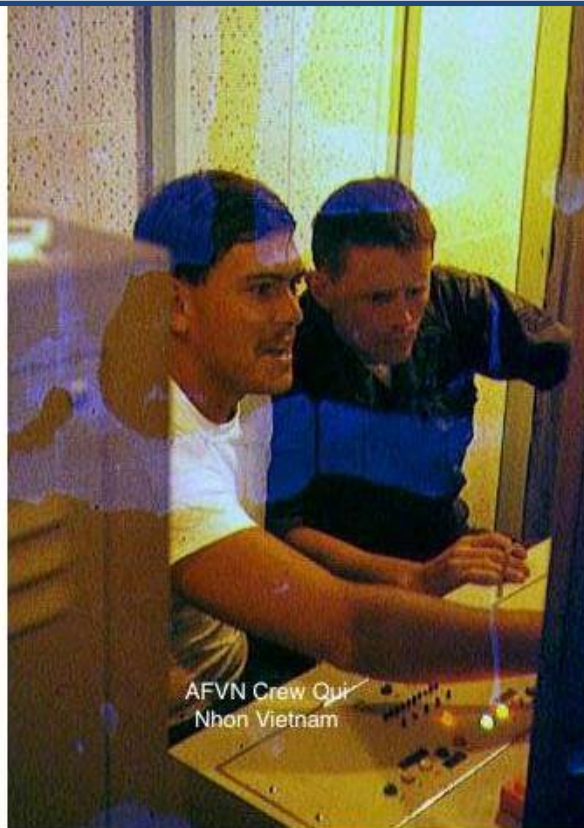

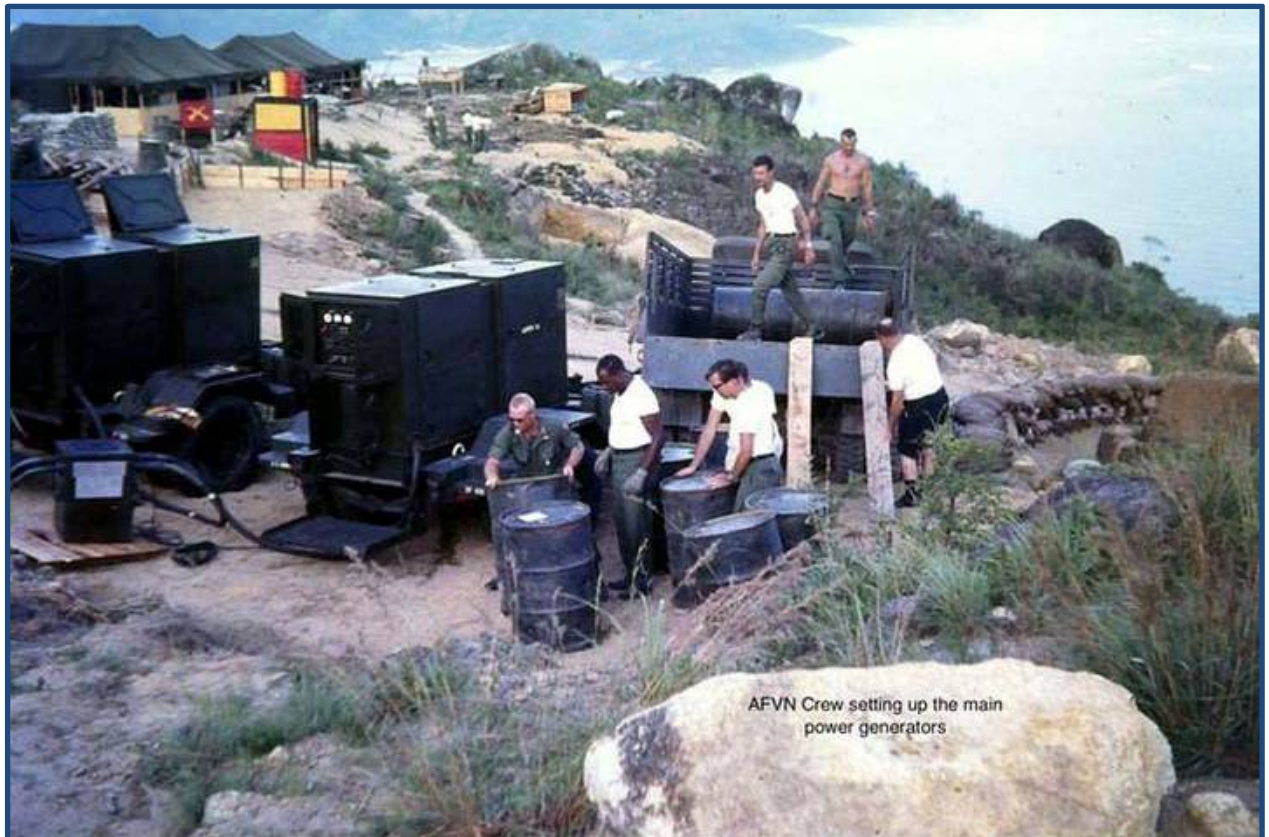

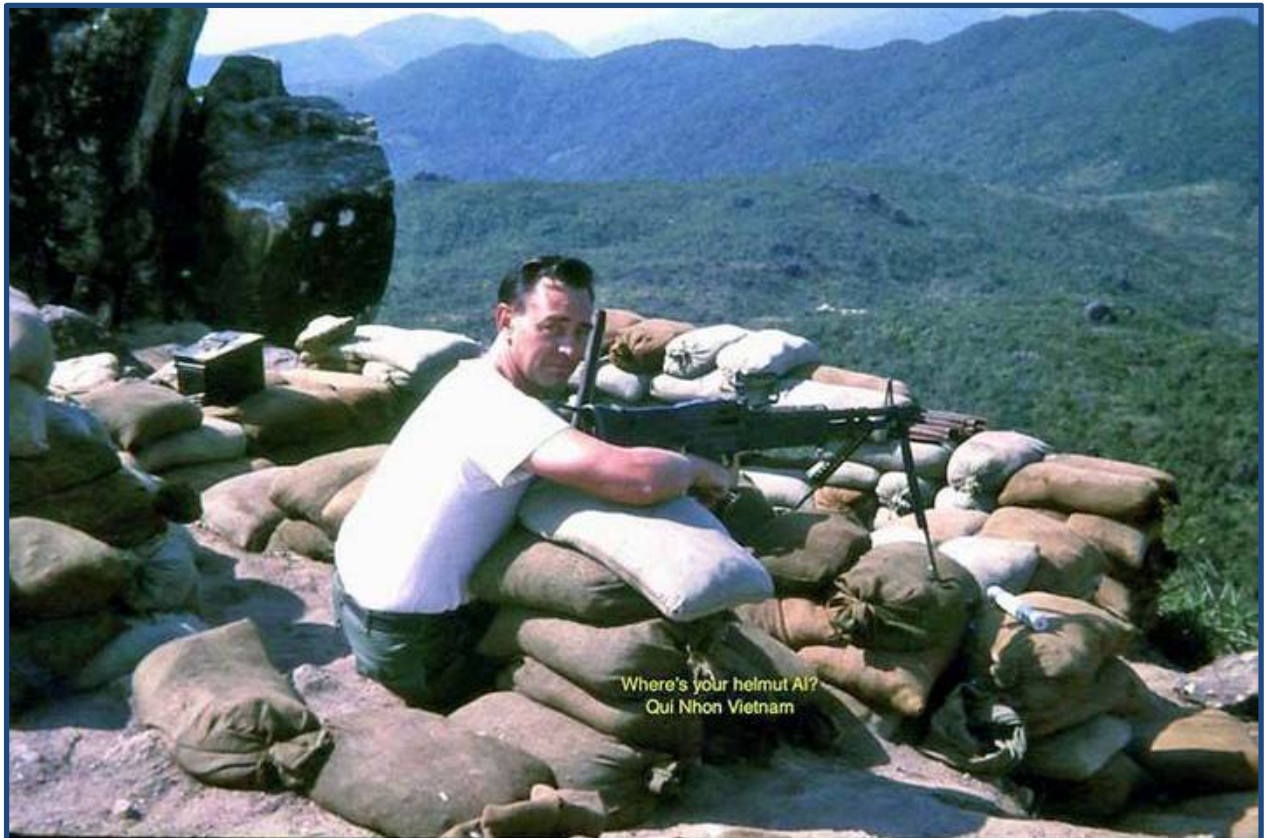

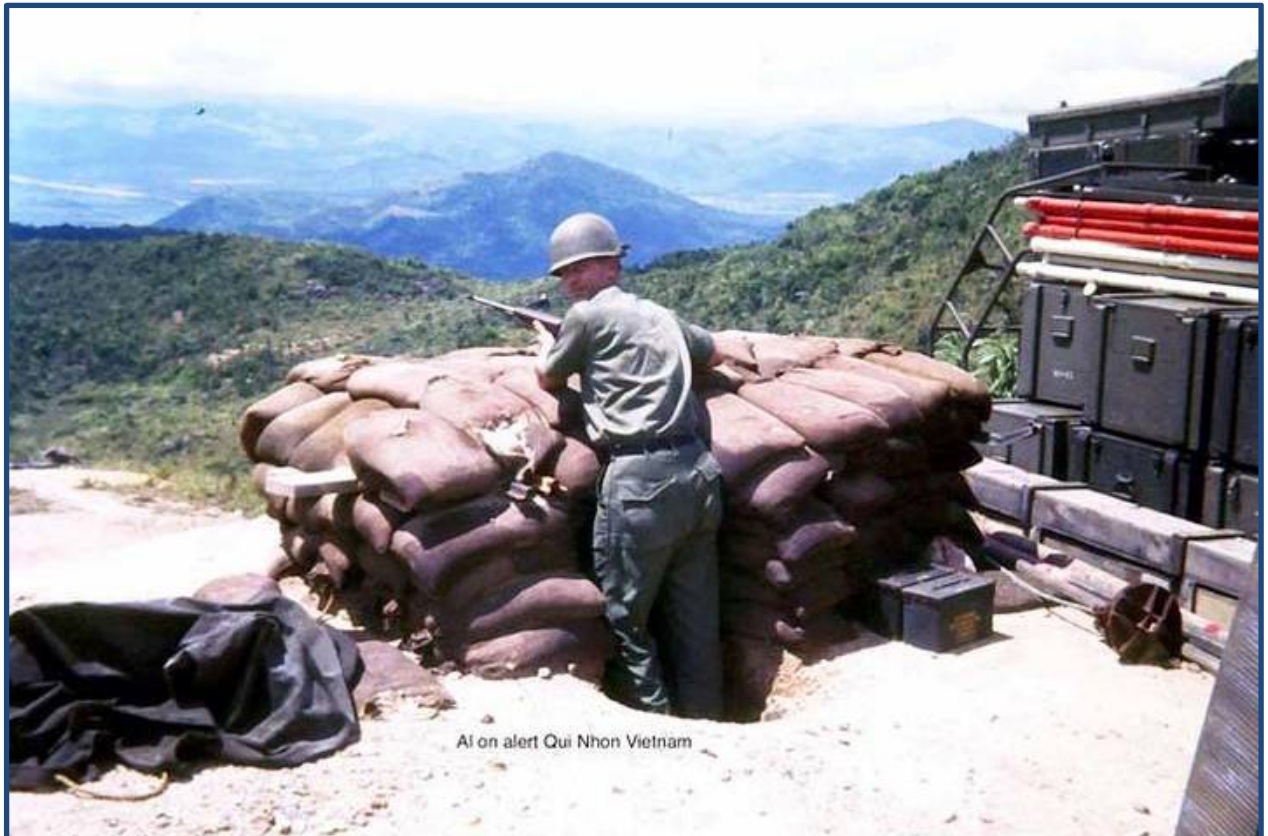

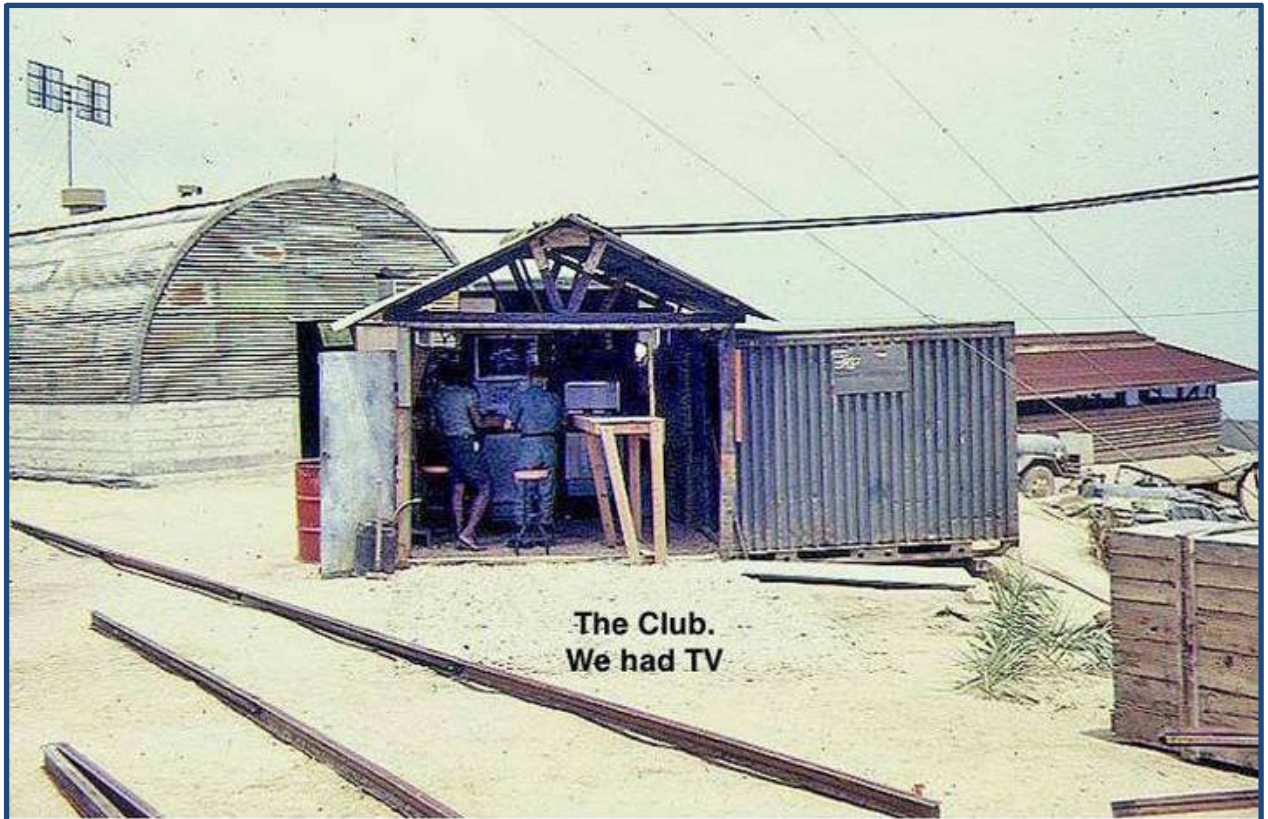

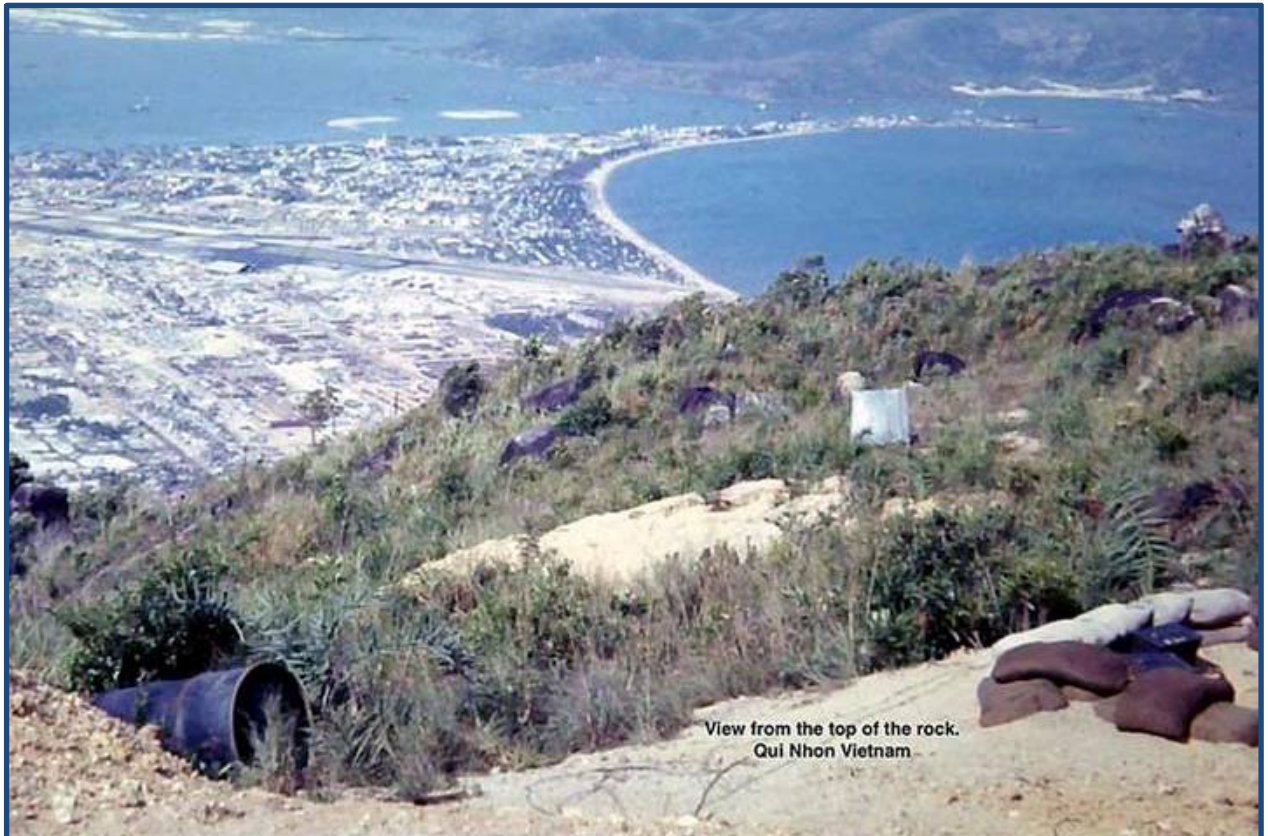

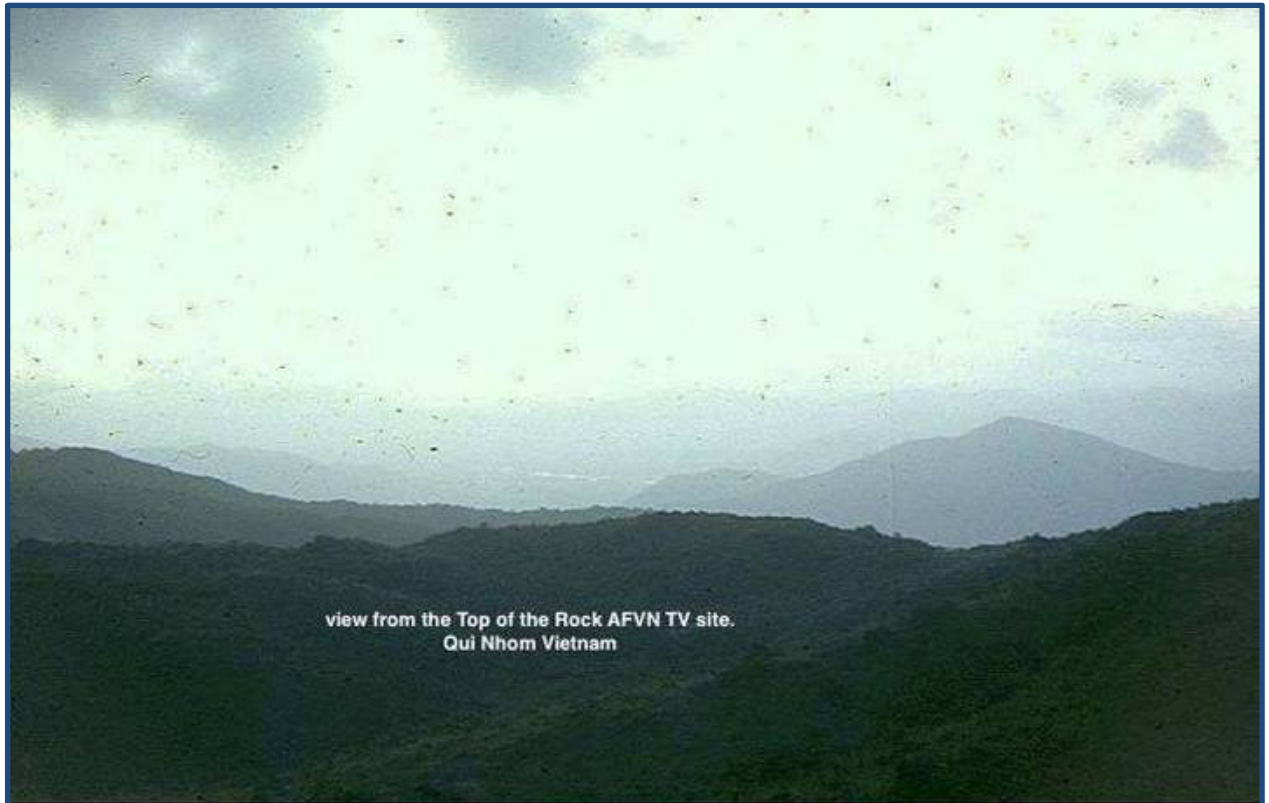

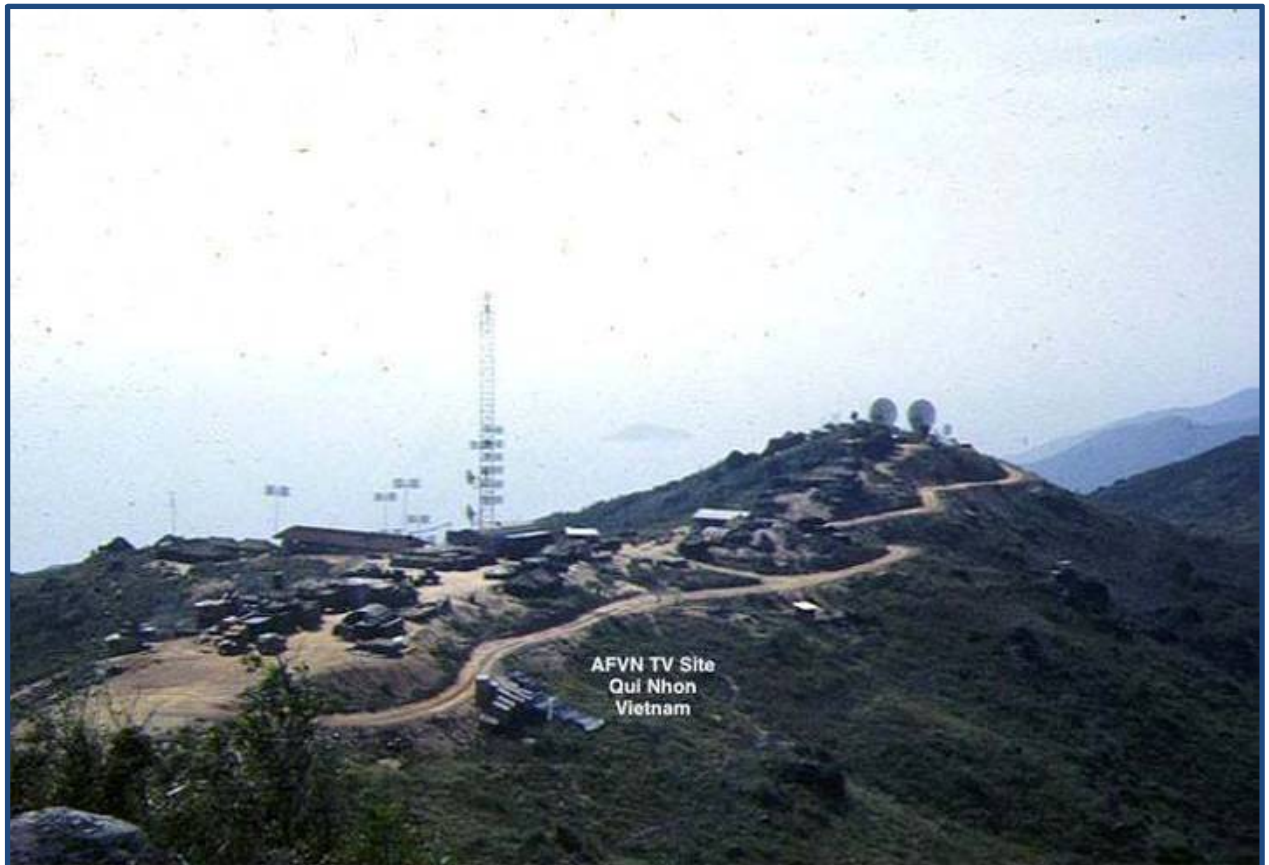

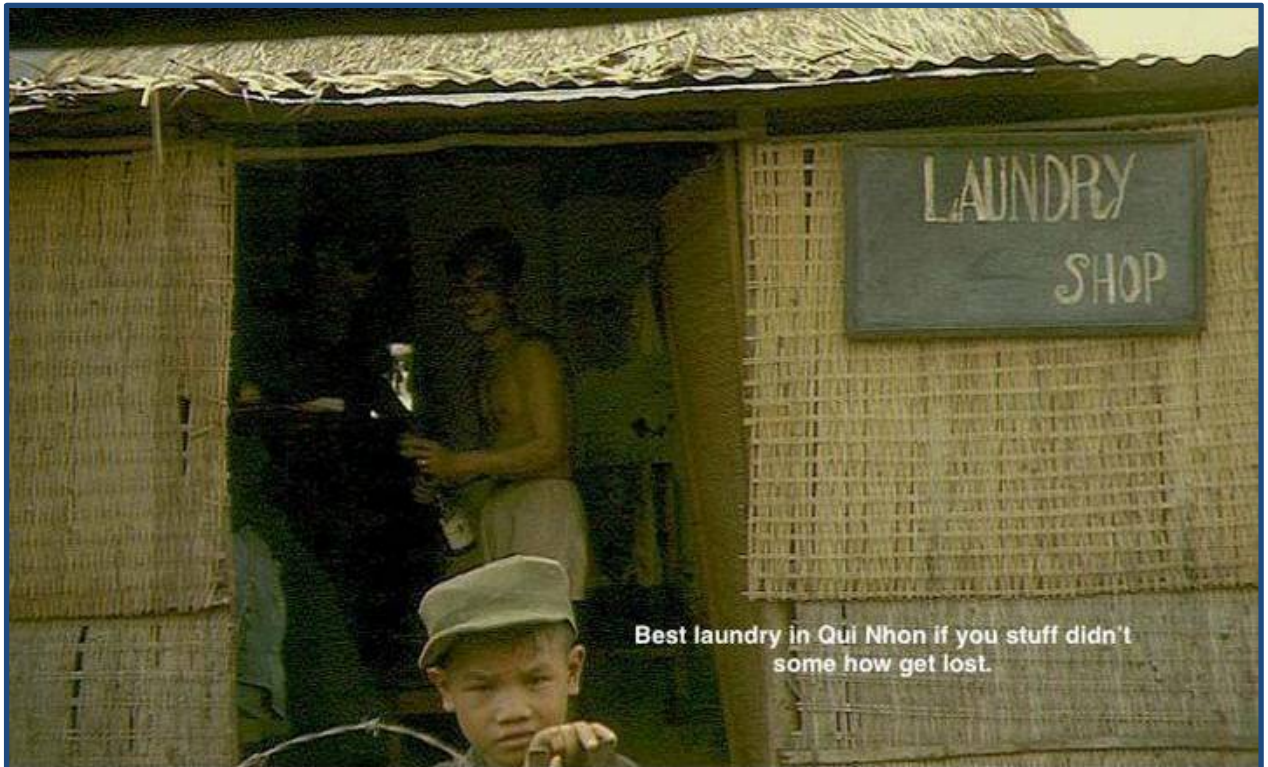

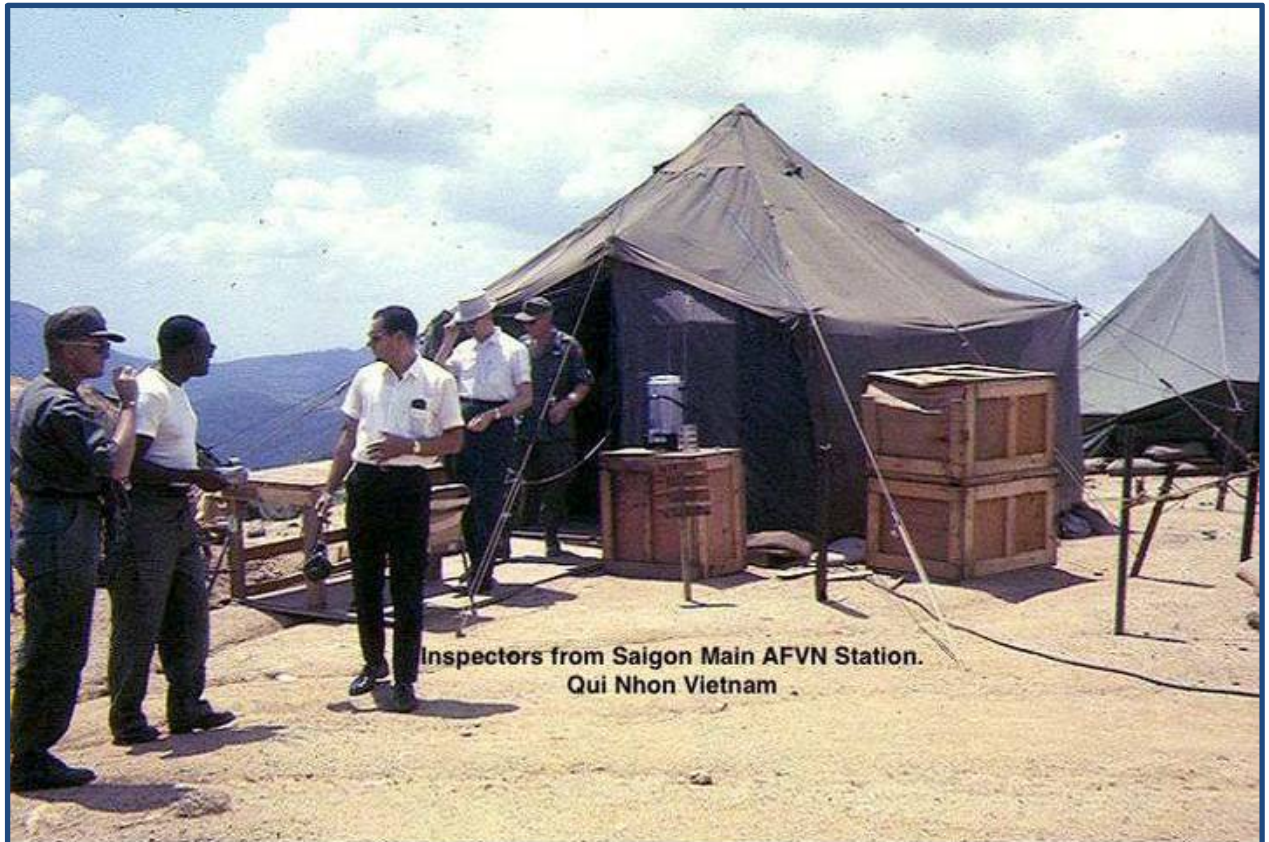
