

# Stewardship Reflections

Today we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast is rather unique in that it honors a doctrine rather than an event. What we are commemorating today is a central reality of our Christian faith, that God is Trinitarian in nature - three distinct persons - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - in one God.

The Church calls this truth a mystery, as indeed it is. This week let's re-invite God into the midst of our lives and make sure the way we spend our time and energy each day shows Him our profound gratitude for His many gifts to us - but above all the gift of Himself in the Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
