Lloyd J. Kuhl, 77, of Sebewaing, died Monday, February 6, 2006, at his home following a lengthy illness. He was born January 20, 1929 in Fairhaven Township, son of the late Edward and Leah (Braun) Kuhl. He was united in marriage to Belva A. Dorland on May 8, 1953 in Cass City. Lloyd grew up on a dairy farm near Sebewaing and was later employed at Gettel John Deere in Sebewaing for 40 years before retiring in 1994.
