Have you been thinking about starting a Pepsi club/chapter? Do you know others that live in your area that are Pepsi collectors, too? Starting a club is easy to do; the hard part is finding the time to do it.

One of the first things you need to do is to let people know about the club. Some examples of doing this are: notices on the bulletin boards of stores, antique shops and flea markets. If you live near a Pepsi plant, drop off some notices and ask if they could be put in the break room. I have even gone up to Pepsi drivers or other Pepsi employees in stores and told them about the club and given them notices. Today, you can use the internet to find members; create a Facebook page or use craigslist, for example.

Where are you going to meet? It doesn't have to be in your house immediately. Check out some local restaurants, cafes or churches, libraries, parks, or just any place where you can sit and visit. As you get to know others, you can then elect whether to bring them back to your house to see your collection.

Provided that you get a group together, you will have fun visiting and talking about your Pepsi collections; so you must now decide how often you would like to get together. Most of our local clubs/chapters meet every other month. Do you decide to meet at the same place every time or will you travel depending upon which member would like to host? Hosting is a simple matter; you find a place to meet near where you live or in your home. The host simply arranges for the place to meet and can provide drinks, eats or nothing if you are meeting outside of the home.

Once you have a core group then you can decide on other factors such as: membership dues, formal or informal type meetings, officers, and other things you will experience as you start to grow.

Hi, my name is Larry Woestman. I have been a member of the PCCC since 1991 and have been to every Pepsi Fest from 1992 on. I am a member of the board of directors as Vice-President and I've been to one Las Vegas event and two East Coast events.

I started my Pepsi collecting in 1990 at an antique store where I found two double dot syrup line glasses. They were \$7.00 each and all the other glasses were around \$1.00. I fell in love with the double dot script logo and bought both of them. I looked for more Pepsi pieces but couldn't find any. The more I looked and couldn't find, the more I wanted. Sound familiar?



As I look back to my very first Pepsi piece, it was a bookend logo menu board but I don't remember where I got it. That had to be around1976. I used it at Boy Scout meetings and Camporee events.

I read in a local paper about a person's Pepsi collection on display at a local library so I went to see it and was blown away by all the neat Pepsi stuff he had. I found out about the Pepsi Cola Collectors Club from a sign in the display. I joined and went to the 1992 Pepsi Fest where I finally met the person by the name of Phil Dillman whose collection I saw at the library. I was hooked. Guard unit that guarded the Pacific Air Force headquarters building and would greet VIPs as they arrived at Hickham AFB.


I have been involved with the Boy Scout program for over 50 yrs, from my Cub Scout years

"Wouldn't It Be Great If...? - by Phil Dillman

A story that I recently heard from a Pepsi collector made me chuckle but is also one that many of us can relate to. When he and his wife first started collecting Pepsi memorabilia in 1986, they were filled with enthusiasm about everything Pepsi. They learned that New Bern, North Carolina, was were the great taste of Pepsi-Cola was created so they traveled down there in 2001 from their home in Indianapolis, Indiana, to see what they could find and hopefully add to their collection. They found a few items and told some of the people there that they were Pepsi collectors. They were told that they should attend Pepsi Fest, the Pepsi collector's convention. They asked where it was held and were told Indianapolis, right in the city where they live! A place where, except during 1998, the PCCC had been meeting annually since 1987.

How many of us started collecting Pepsi completely unaware of the Pepsi-Cola Collectors Club? I know I did and I know a few others, as well. While several of us are trying different ways to promote the club and to bring in new members, there is one surefire approach that would help promote the club and share the colorful history of the Pepsi-Cola Company with others while preserving Pepsi-related memorabilia; A <u>museum</u>.

"The History of Pepsi-Cola and Mountain Dew Museum", or whatever name is approved, would be a place that most people would enjoy whether they were collectors or not. They could be educated, entertained, and refreshed. Local schools could bring their students in for tours. Everyone could learn about Pepsi's history as well as the many different aspects of advertising. They could also learn about the PCCC while buying collectibles in the gift shop. Wouldn't it be great if such a place existed?

While many of us in the PCCC would love to see the creation of a Pepsi museum that is open to the general public, I believe the only way for such a museum to become a reality is through the efforts of the club members and their abilities to solicit funding through donations and writing grants for this proposed preservation and educational facility. We would need the help of people with the knowledge and resources to make this happen. Once created, this museum could be self-sustaining in the right location, especially if it were within an existing building or business. Such a museum could use funds or income from gift shop sales to purchase the increased number of Pepsi collections that are being sold, adding some of the items to the museum's displays while selling any duplicate items through the gift shop or online.

A logical location would be in the Midwestern United States, perhaps the northwest corner of Indianapolis, Indiana. This area already has considerable traffic flow, is basically in the center of most of the U. S. population, is about ten miles from an International airport, has many tourist draws such as the Speedway, and is away from weather extremes such as hurricanes, flooding, and wildfires, plus less chance for damaging earthquakes. A similar location would be near Nashville, Tennessee. Naturally, these are just suggestions.

Obviously, there are many other things to consider in such an endeavor which don't need to be listed here but could certainly use the expertise of any of you that have personal experience in owning and/or operating a business and with business laws or requirements. WE WANT TO HEAR FROM EVERYONE! Please leave your feedback or opinions on the PCCC website. I had numerous green "by Barney and Ally" bottles of each year and two of the clear bottles. I also had the Party Jug, the 1 pint 10 oz, and 99% of the name bottles. The hard work paid off.

Though I have sold off my collection, there is something very important that remains. Over the years that I collected, I was honored to have acquired many friends. These were fellow collectors that the hobby brought me into contact with and, though my collection doesn't - they all remain. You can't beat it.

I was also honored to have met and to have spent some time with Charlie Gordon, the owner of Tri-City Beverage in Johnson City, TN. This was the first place Mountain Dew was commercially sold. I called Charlie up one day and asked him if I could visit him to ask him some questions about his role in Mountain Dew. His gracious answer was yes. Charlie spent the whole morning with me and also supplied lunch. He wasn't bottling Mountain Dew any longer so I got to enjoy Dr. Enuf with lunch. During my visit with him he signed each of my Tri-City bottles.

A few of the other Mountain Dew related activities that I'm proud of include being part of the team that organized and produced both of the two Mountain Dew museum exhibits. I coauthored the book "Mountain Dew: Hillbilly Collectables" with Dick Bridgforth. I was asked and was on PAX TV in Virginia Beach to talk about collecting Mountain Dew. Pepsi-flavored Cheetos are now available in Japan and on eBay. Yes, really!

PepsiCo's India branch is <u>launching Pepsi Atom</u>, a new soda product specifically "developed for the Indian consumer," according to PepsiCo India beverages CEO Gautham Mukkavilli. Pepsi Atom will come in a 25 cl. can, a 50 cl. <u>PET bottle</u> and a 20 cl. glass bottle.

The Mountain Dew Museum in Wartrace, Tennessee - by Phil Dillman






Stan & Rita Dismukes


The Dismukes made sure that the ECPC attendees were able to visit the store and the ECPC organizers made sure the Dismukes could attend our event, as well.
