

Quiminha produces hundreds of tons of products

Hundreds of tons of peppers, tomatoes and potatoes are being harvested from the *Integrated Agricultural and Regional Development Project of Quiminha*, in the municipality of Icolo and Bengo, in Luanda.

Found this Thursday, November 3rd, the Governor of Luanda, Higinio Carneiro and the Minister for Agriculture, Alexander Nhunga, on a visit to various agricultural projects in this municipality.

The Minister said that, at this time, more than 40 tons per hectare are being harvested, plus more 120,000 tons of pepper and 200 tons of tomatoes also per cycle.

According to the official, it is hoped that with the completion of the factory, in assembly, and with the production of soy and eggs, the shortages of these products will be mitigated in the province of Luanda, the great center of consumption in the country.

Alexandre Nhunga also informed that "instead of directing all production to the supermarkets, an informal market will now be created at kilometer 30, where at weekends the population will be able to purchase good quality products at low prices".

The agricultural project of Quiminha is an investment from the Angolan Government and aims to achieve the President's goal towards economic diversification.

The project intends to increase the supply of food products, with emphasis on vegetables.
