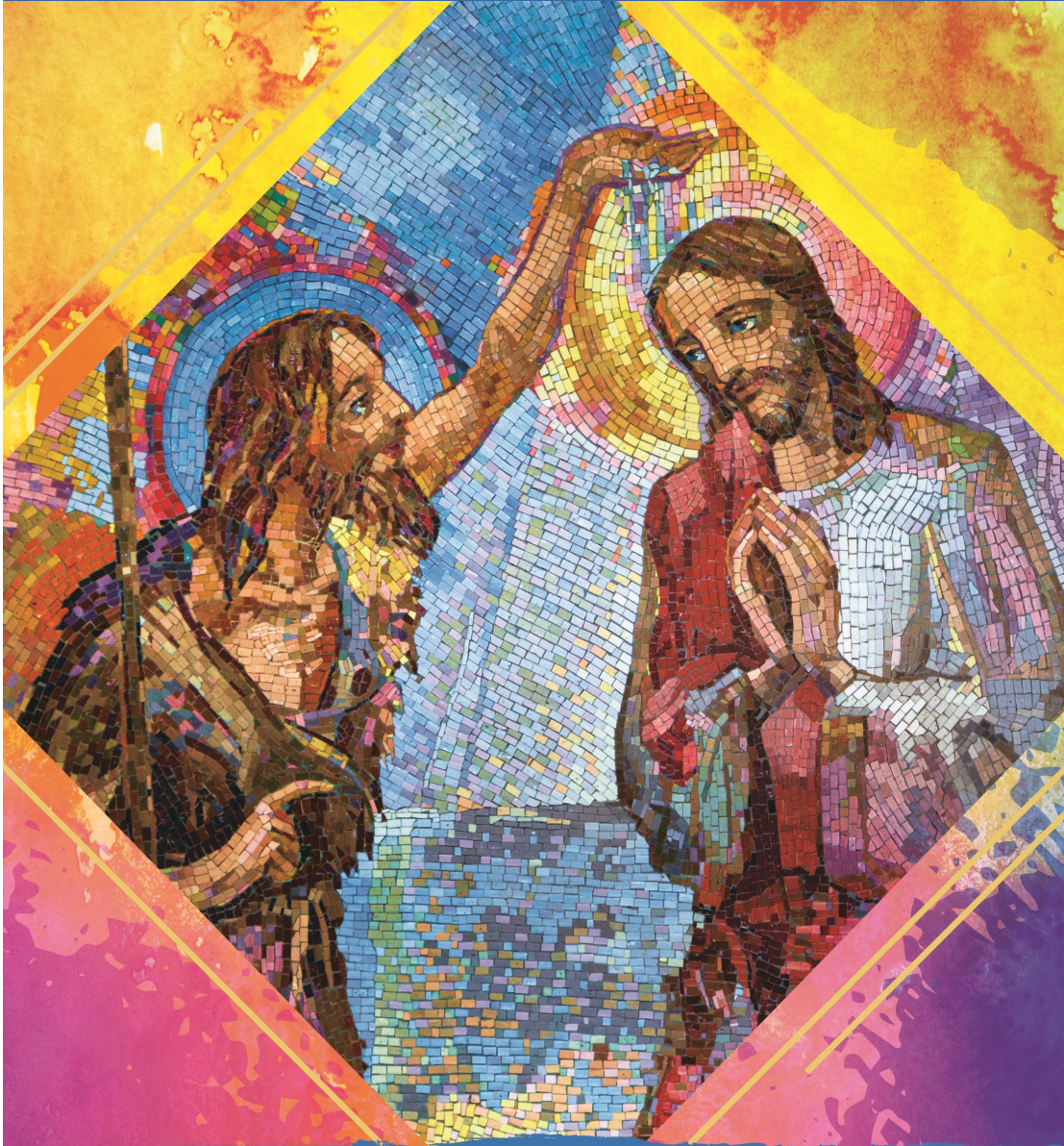

Pastoral Reflection

As I mentioned in my homily last week, I'd like to do a series on Catholic Social Teaching for the next few months. I've had a few conversations with Catholics who are trying to make sense of the many problems, conflicts and concerning events in our nation and world. How should we as Catholics respond? Each of us is ultimately responsible for our own decisions as intelligent and free individuals. But we don't have to figure it all out on our own. We are guided by our own conscience, which is shaped and formed by the Gospels and the teachings of the Church. So, since conscience is so important, what does it mean?

The Vatican II document "Gaudium et Spes" defines conscience as "man's most secret core, and his sanctuary. There he is alone with God, whose voice echoes in his depths. By conscience, in a wonderful way, that law is made known which is fulfilled in the love of God and one's neighbor" (16). Furthermore, the document added: "Through loyalty to conscience, Christians are joined to other men in the search for truth and for the right solution to so many moral problems that arise both in the life of individuals and from social relationships" (16). It is important to remember that we, as disciples of Jesus, have an obligation to follow our conscience but also to make sure that it conforms to the Gospels and the universal teachings of the Church. So, reading the Bible and personal prayer are indispensable in our efforts to follow Jesus in responding to the great moral questions of our day. That should be the foundation of the formation of conscience. Thankfully, we also have the guidance of the Church with 2000 years of experience and the wisdom and knowledge that come from existing and thriving in a complicated world. Over the next few months, I plan to share with you the relevant teachings of Popes, Councils, and saints whose experiential wisdom can help shape our individual and collective conscience. Our world is complicated and challenging. We are called to make a difference, but not always sure how. Start with prayer and reading the Gospels. That's the best way to strengthen and shape your conscience. The words of Jesus are powerful and life-changing, and because of that—world-changing. I hope that these presentations of Catholic Social Teaching will provide additional guidance and support to help you in understanding how to share your faith, your discipleship, and your love in a hurting, chaotic, but also beautiful world. —Fr. Larry

Today we are reminded to listen for Jesus' call to follow him. Isaiah realized God's call of service, referring to himself as God's servant, commissioned to proclaim God's salvation to the ends of the earth. Paul recognized that God willed him to be an apostle and today we hear him tell the members of the church in Corinth that God calls them to be holy. John the Baptist points to Jesus as the Lamb of God and Son of God, the one to follow instead of him. May we listen for his call so that we may respond, "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

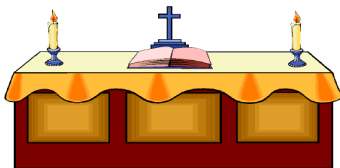
