
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Residents:

The Village of Sheridan is planning for this years sidewalk improvements!

During the month of April, the Village Board shall accept public comments of any landowner desiring financial assistance for repairs or replacement of sidewalk adjacent to their property. The Street and Alley Committee shall by April of each year present to the Village Board a resolution containing a sidewalk improvement plan. In selecting sidewalks to be placed on the sidewalk improvement plan, the Street and Alley Committee shall take into consideration the condition of any existing sidewalk, the need for a sidewalk, the expected traffic for the sidewalk, and whether an owner adjoining a sidewalk is willing to participate in a 60%/40% payment agreement where the owner agrees to pay 40% of the cost of sidewalk improvements with the City paying the remaining 60% costs of improvements. If a landowner fails to get a required sidewalk placed on the annual improvement plan, such landowner may repair or install a sidewalk in any street, alley or public ground adjacent to their property but only after approval of the plans and subject to conditions approved by the Street and Alley Committee. Conditions and standards for approval shall be similar to conditions and standards normally undertaken by the Street and Alley Committee for work performed as part of their annual plan for sidewalk improvements.



If you would like the committee to review sidewalks in your area, please contact Village Hall.

The Streets Department is also beginning a review of village trees for our yearly maintenance. If you have any concerns regarding Village trees-please report this to Village Hall and our maintenance department will Review these for recommendations to the Trustee.

Village of Sheridan Newsletter-Sheridan Fire Department

February 2026

The Sheridan Fire Department responded to less ambulance calls in 2025 than in 2024. Attached is the call sheet for 2025.

The district will be starting to work on the new budget for FY 26-27 in the coming months.

Review of 2025 grants received:

OSFM Small Equipment Grant--\$10,747.00

IPRF Safety Grant --\$2970.00

DNR Equipment Grant--\$7100.00

So far in 2026—IPRF Safety Grant--\$2934.00. The district has applied for the OSFM Small Equipment Grant again, which includes hose, a combination of a battery-operated spreader cutter rescue tool and extrication cribbing for the new engine due to be picked up by Chief Tirevold and Asst. Chief Cook in March down in Louisiana from Ferrera Fire Equipment. This is a tentative month for completion.

The new ambulance is scheduled for July 2026 pickup from Foster Coach Sales. The current 2006 ambulance will go on the auction block this spring prior to the arrival of the new ambulance.

We currently have a total of 15 staff on the roster. Just as a reminder we have 2 FF/EMTs on duty at station from 7 am to 7 pm. At nighttime, 7 pm to 7 am, we have 2 FF/EMTs on call. All staff are PART TIME. The district has no FULL-TIME staff.

Like most departments, everyone is short of help. The district's long-term plan is to get full time staff on board 24/7/365.

Just another reminder, PLEASE make sure your house numbers are posted on your house if you live in the Village limits. There are still quite a few that don't have them.

ROTH ID TAGS are still available!

The ROTH ID TAG Identification System is an information tag that can be affixed to a child's car seat. In the event of an emergency, the tag pulls from the car seat and becomes an emergency identification wristband.



ROTH ID TAGS are durable, reflective, waterproof/heat/UV resistant tag that adheres to almost any hard surface. The tag includes an area on the back for users to write emergency information, along with two adhesive strips to apply the ROTH ID TAG, and one adhesive tab to utilize the wristband when needed.

In the event of an emergency, the ROTH ID TAG removable strip can be detached from the tag and used as an emergency medical wristband by first responders. This reduces the risk of misinformation or loss of information in chaotic emergency situations.

The ROTH ID TAG was created after tragedy struck the "Roth" family.

On December 23, 2022, Julie Roth, beloved wife and mother, was traveling with her two small children when they were caught up in a 47+ vehicle pile-up on the Ohio Turnpike. Julie and Edna Rose, the baby she was carrying, did not survive, but her two other children did.

Injured and afraid, Julie's two toddlers waited many hours to see a familiar face while emergency responders worked to identify them and contact their father, who was at work. Thankfully, Ayla and Rory Roth are alive and well today. They are the true reason for the ROTH ID TAG™ creation.



TAGS are free for Sheridan residents, \$8.00 each for non-residents. For older children no longer in car seats, travelers tags are also available for \$20.00 for non-residents and \$10.00 for residents. They can be picked up at Village Hall during business hours.
