

42. (Cont'd) end boards. A square, one-story wing was added to the rear. It has a moderately pitched gable roof but no chimney except for a recent sheet metal flue. The wing was probably added by Charles Fisher as a press house. It has one large service door in the north wall that is flanked on either side by a window. The service door is topped by a seven light transom.

43. (Cont'd.) property around 1880 and erected a wine cellar and tasting house nearby in 1883 (ERI-1617). Mr. Fisher operated one of a large number of small island wineries. However, the presence of a tasting house made his business somewhat unique. Born in 1855 in Ohio, Charles, with his wife, Sophia and four children ran their business until 1905, and remained in their house until at least 1915. (One source indicates that this house was originally officers' barracks on Johnson's Island and was later brought to Kelleys Island. This has not been substantiated.)

44. (Cont'd.) of the house. It straddled the creek when it was standing. A plain rectangular limestone carriage block sits near the road in front of the house.
