Mother's Day in Germany

Mother's Day (*Muttertag*) is usually celebrated on the second Sunday of May, unless this happens to be the Pentecost (*Pfingstsonntag*), and then Mother's Day is celebrated a week earlier, on the first Sunday of May. The holiday stretches back to a day of celebration that

used to be held in the state of Thuringia in spring. Families would take a day off work to visit relatives. and



mark the renewal of the seasons - and mothers were considered another symbol of life and fertility. After 1945, the day had the political sting taken out of it, and mothers have since typically been honoured with cards, flowers and presents rather than bronze, silver and gold medals. Mothers often also get other tokens of appreciation, including phone calls, breakfast in bed, or fancy meals out. Some families also take white flowers to the graves of their grandmothers and great-grandmothers.
