

Paul Bashore Tice, Jr. (October 29, 1923 – July 18, 2009)

York- Paul B. Tice, Jr., 85, died Saturday July 18, 2009 at Rest Haven. He was the loving husband of Marian L. (Rothermel) Tice. The couple celebrated their 62nd wedding anniversary on August 17, 2008.

Mr. Tice was born on October 29, 1923 in Lebanon, PA, a son of the late Paul and Virgie (Sando) Tice, Sr. Mr. Tice was a licensed Public Accountant and was self-employed at Tice Associates, P.C. He never really retired, working a few days a week up until his death.

Mr. Tice served our country for three years in the US Navy during WWII. He was a flag signalman for Admiral Wm. Halsey's fast carrier task force in the Pacific on the USS Wild Bill Hickox Fletcher Class Destroyer. Paul was a Charter Member of the West York Optimist Club, a Charter Member of the South Central Chapter of Pa Society of Public Accountants where he served as Secretary. Grand Lodge of Free & Accepted Masons of Pa.
