Before Worship

We ask that conversations and greetings before the worship service happen in the Narthex. We try to keep the Nave as a space for quiet prayer and contemplation as we enter into worship.

What's Happening

The bulletin is your guide to everything happening in our parish. It contains everything you need to fully participate in the service. Some of the music we will sing can be found here in the bulletin or the Red or Blue hymnal in your pew.

Receiving Communion

- You're Invited: This is Jesus' table; he made no restrictions, and neither do we.
- Host: Our communion is by bread or wafer. The priest or deacon will place the sacrament in your hand.
- Wine: You are invited to receive the wine by the common cup, either by sipping (please guide the chalice with your hand) or by intinction (dipping the wafer in the wine).
- If you would like to receive in the single-serving cups, a Eucharistic Minister will have a tray of cups by the right ambulatory.
- Gluten-free wafers are available. Ask the priest for one when you come up.
- Healing Prayer: If you would like someone to pray for you for healing of mind, body, or spirit, you're invited to go to the side chapel at any time during Communion.

Children

We welcome children to participate fully, and we do not expect them to be perfectly quiet. If your child needs a break, feel free to bring them to the Narthex (lobby) or make use of our Nursery: take a left as you exit the worship space, down the hall.

The main restrooms are off the Parish Hall, to your right as you exit the worship space. A gender-neutral restroom is located to your left as you exit the worship space, down the hall.

Wheelchair Accommodations

There are wheelchair-friendly spaces in the pews, on the outside aisles. Accessible restroom stalls are in the main restrooms off the Parish Hall, to your right as you exit the worship space.

Hearing Assistance

Hearing devices are located on the table near the main entrance. Please ask an usher for assistance.

The Gospel

Luke 21:25-36

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Deacon: **People**: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. 
strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."

The Leader and People pray responsively

Leader: As the church worldwide celebrates the beginning of its New Year, let us turn our minds and hearts to the larger community of which we are a part, saying: *Hear our prayer*, *O Lord: Grant us mercy.*

Leader: For all peoples of every race, nation and disposition: May your love so embrace us all, that its power overcomes our conflicts, our defenses, and our fears. Quicken us to our true nature as your children that we may love one another. Hear our prayer, O Lord: *People: Grant us mercy.*

Leader: For all the churches of the world, Orthodox, Catholic, Protestant, and Pentecostal: May we grow together in our understanding of mission, that we may be strengthened in unity and united in acts of service. Call us to the one discipleship with its many gifts. Hear our prayer, O Lord: *People: Grant us mercy.* *Leader*: For all Christian communities, young and growing in Africa, aging and changing in North America: Renew our vision and experience of Christian community as ever birthing, ever transforming, ever young and open to risk, ever old and full of wisdom. This morning we pray for Fort Dauphin in the Diocese of Toliara, the Diocese of Renk, the Diocese of Southeastern Mexico, and the Province of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan. Hear our prayer, O Lord:

People: Grant us mercy.

Leader: For those who live in fear and confusion: Whether they be stateless people in refugee camps, or settled people hidden behind high fences, give to the vulnerable strength, and to the secure vulnerability, that our human compassion for one another may end injustice and give our societies a human face. Leader: For this community, especially for those who suffer most, for the emotionally and physically ill, for the dying, for those who grieve: May we, out of our own suffering, give comfort and support. Hear our prayer, O Lord: *People: Grant us mercy.*

Leader: For the larger community around us, especially for the new born children, the homeless, and the imprisoned: May we create a world where shelter, food and medical care are available for all and where the law protects people for a better chance and better choices. Hear our prayer, O Lord: *People: Grant us mercy.*

Leader: This morning we pray for: Bishop Samy and Venerable Canon Donne; the peace of Jerusalem, for the victims of gun violence; the people served by Sunrise Assisted Living, PADS and the Community Meal program, for those in war-torn places, especially Congo, Sudan, Haiti, Ukraine, Gaza and Israel, for our Scouts and leaders, Karen, Jon, Barb, Judy, Benji, Edward, Nirmala, Jaxson, Greg, Isabell, Debbie, Mark, Jill, Rebecca, Gavin, Dylan, Karen, John, Matt, Dan, Walter, Frank, Linda, Stacy, Jerry; A.S., Honorine, Fernandez, Laundrina, Vanessa, Bein.

Leader: We celebrate with *Brian and Jane* Penticoff (12/1) on their anniversary. Grant that their wills may be so knit together in your will, and their spirits in your Spirit, that they may grow in love and peace with you and one another all the days of their lives. Hear our prayer, O Lord:

People: Grant us mercy.

Leader: O God, our times are in your hand: look with favor, we pray, on your servant **Deb** Gallinger (12/6) as she begins another year. Grant that she may grow in wisdom and grace, and strengthen her trust in you all the days of her life. Hear our prayer, O Lord: **People: Grant us mercy**.

Celebrant: We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

> On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

People: We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

Celebrant: And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.
We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with the Blessed Virgin Mary and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your children; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.
