I was surrounded by nineteen quilters of diverse quilting levels, quilting styles, ages, backgrounds, and quilting advice (lots of advice). After the retreat, I was hooked and joined their guild.

After attending guild meetings I quickly discovered that modern day quilting guilds are not exactly the same as the quilting bees that I saw on TV. What they have in common is getting together for the purpose of quilting and community which is what drew me into guilds. The guilds I belong to (including ours) do those things and much more. There are meetings with guest speakers sharing their experiences and quilts, there are workshops with opportunities to learn techniques, and charity activities. In addition to these activities, guilds like ours run a quilt raffle and host a quilt show.

With such a variety of activities our guild has so much to offer. And with so much to offer it takes a lot of work. Work that takes many people to do. The success of a guild depends on it. Each time I have joined a group I promise myself that I am going to just be a member and not raise my hand to volunteer for anything. That idea only seems to last for a short while when without even realizing it my hand seems to take over and is raised to volunteer. I never (well rarely) regret taking on a bigger role in the groups I belong to and the rewards are worth the work.

Hospitality Chair Needed

We are looking for a Hospitality Chair. Unfortunately, if we are unable to find a chair we will no longer be able to provide drinks and snacks at meetings. Donna, our most recent Hospitality chair has done a great job of streamlining the hospitality operation and is available to walk her replacement through the logistics.

Duties of the Hospitality and Special Events Committee Chair:

- Coordinates members contributing refreshments at each meeting.
- Maintains inventory of necessary supplies.
- Ensures proper set-up and cleanup of the meeting room and kitchen.
- Responsible for planning and acting as host for all Special Events the Guild holds during the year, such as; the Holiday Party, Anniversary Party, Ice Cream Social, etc. as well as any other program events that are not considered instructional.
- Coordinates with Program Chair to schedule special events, to be published in the program calendar at least three (3) months in advance.

If you are able to take on this position - Thank You. There are also other options if you would like to help with hospitality but might not be able to do it every month. Do you want to share the position with someone else or maybe you can do two or three months in a row and then hand it off to someone else for the next few months.

4-H Fair Quilt Show Chair/Co-Chair Needed

The Hunterdon County 4-H Fair is held each year in August and includes a judged quilt show. Courthouse Quilters and Hunterdon County Quilting Guild alternate coordinating the quilt show at the fair. This year it is our turn. Participation at the 4-H fair also gives us an opportunity to sell handmade items and Caring Hearts Quilts in a Boutique.

The work for the fair has already started and we need a volunteer to serve as the 4-H Fair Quilt Show chair. The work that is needed is well documented and prior chairs are available to answer questions.

Raffle Quilt Sales Chair Needed

It is time to start the sales phase for the 2026 Raffle Quilt, Aegean Sea. Thank you to Juliet Leonard and her team for creating the beautiful quilt that will raffled in the fall of 2026. The raffle might sound like a long way off but the process to sell tickets needs to start now. The licensing process takes time and needs to be done so tickets can be printed by this fall. We can start selling tickets a year in advance to the drawing.

Duties and Responsibilities of the Raffle Quilt Sales Chair:

- Assist Treasurer/License Chairperson to apply for local raffle drawing license from the location
 where raffle drawing will take place. Licensing needs to be complete and tickets ready for the
 summer of the year preceding the Quilt Show, so that tickets are sold for 1 year before the Quilt
 Show.
- Purchase raffle tickets. Both the NJ StateLicense number and the Local Drawing License number from the location where the raffle will take place are required to be printed on the ticket.
- Distribution of tickets to members and events. May delegate the distribution of tickets to a Raffle Quilt Sales Committee Member.
- Accountable for keeping track of ticket numbers, including unsold tickets, and money received.
- Stores raffle guilt, guilt hanging equipment and petty cash box.
- Finds various locations and events to sell raffle tickets.
- Organize and coordinate with CHQ member(s) the selling of tickets, supplying raffle quilt, hanging equipment and petty cash box.
- Aids in ensuring that each member sells 20 tickets.
- Promotes raffle ticket sales.
- Responsible for Quilt Show ticket sales, display Raffle Quilt and set up the quilt and Raffle Quilt table at Quilt show and manage ticket drawing at Quilt Show.
- Along with Treasurer/License Chairperson the Raffle Ticket Distribution and Sales Chairperson is required to be familiar with and adhere to current NJ State Raffle Regulations, which currently include the requirement for a separate checking account, which will be overseen by the Treasurer.

- Sea Glass Quilts:
 - o Background Fabric: 15 X 24 or 24 X 24
 - Sea glass pieces: colors your choice
 - Heat & Bond
 - Parchment Paper or pressing sheet
 - o Fabric Scissors
 - Ironing board
 - Iron
 - Sewing machine if you come ready to sew
- Shadfest Poster:
 - Use whatever materials/techniques (mini quilt, fabric, paper, wood, painting, drawing, anything) you want to create a Shadfest poster
 - o You do not have to finish during the workshop you can start or finish at home
 - Poster blanks are 11"x17" and have a logo printed on them in portrait orientation usable space closer to 11"x13"
 - Double sided tape will be available at the workshop for mounting
 - Gina will pick up poster blanks the week before the workshop -they do run out of poster blanks, so please do not wait until the last week to sign up
