MINUTES OF REGULAR SESSION OF COUNCIL WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 15, 2020

Regular session of Borough Council convened at 7:33 pm. Present were Councilors Janice Matyasovsky, Tim Sloss, Mike Matlos, Mrs. McClelland, Mr. Gretz, Mrs. Lape, and Mr. Zrenchak; Mayor Larry Sikorski; Solicitor Matt Racunas; and Engineer Adam Prince.

PUBLIC COMMENTS.

The owner of the building lives in New York and does not return our phone calls or acknowledge our attempts to get a hold of him. Mrs. Matyasovsky called for a motion to adopt the First Commonwealth Bank Public Body Resolution 2020-02 for changes of signatures on the bank accounts. The motion was made by Mr. Matlos, seconded by Mr. Gretz and passed unanimously.

PERSONNEL. Mrs. McClelland, Chairman, reporting.

Mrs. McClelland called for a motion to accept the verbal resignation from Melissa Morgan on 12/26/2019 as Assistant Secretary. Mr. Matlos made the motion, seconded by Mrs. Matyasovsky and passed unanimously.

Melissa Morgan, 3331 Oakland Dr., asked Council how the police found out what Mrs. Morgan was asking for in her contract before it was presented back to Mr. Racunas and herself. Mr. Zrenchak asked Mr. Racunas to answer. Mr. Racunas asked Mrs. Morgan to repeat the question. Mrs. Morgan explained to Mr. Racunas that the police knew what she was asking for in her contract before it was presented back to Mr. Racunas and herself. Mr. Racunas said he had no idea how that would happen. Mrs. Morgan said that she didn't expect Mr. Racunas to know the answer to that question. Mr. Zrenchak explained that there are a lot of things in the Borough that get out beforehand. He told Mrs. Morgan that she was on Council with them and she should already be aware that there are a lot of items that Council wants to discuss in private and those items get out before they even had a chance to discuss them. Mr. Zrenchak said he doesn't know who the person is that would discuss private matters outside chambers, but he realizes that it happens. Mrs. Morgan said that is what she wants to know, who the person is.

Mrs. McClelland called for a motion to advertise to fill the position of Borough Secretary/Treasurer. The motion was made by Mrs. Matyasovsky, seconded by Mr. Matlos and passed unanimously.

STREETS & SEWERS. Mr. Zrenchak, Chairman, reporting.

Mr. Zrenchak stated that the auto dialer for the pump station needed to be installed. He said that it has to be done because the old one is outdated and eventually will need to be replaced. Also, Mr. Zrenchak explained that Liberty Borough had three change orders for Penn Vest that was signed. He said that this will close out Penn Vest project for the sewer system fund. Mr. Gretz asked Mr. Zrenchak to explain to the public what the auto dialer was for. Mr. Zrenchak explained that the dialer was an alarm for the pump station. He said the dialer alerts us if there is a problem down at the pump station to keep sewage from going into the river. It also alerts us if we have a malfunction at pump station.

Mr. Zrenchak called for a motion to install the dialer in the pump station. The motion was made by Mr. Matlos, seconded by Mrs. Matyasovsky and passed unanimously.

SOLICITOR RACUNAS'S REPORT.

Mr. Racunas called for a motion to adopt Ordinance 2020-01 setting the sewage rates for 2020 at \$11.50 per thousand gallons (or any part thereof), \$151.20 flat rate for unmetered users, and \$15.00 per quarter surcharge for all users. The motion was made by Mr. Matlos, seconded by Mrs. McClelland and passed unanimously.

Mr. Racunas called for a motion to adopt Resolution 2020-01 establishing the tax rate for the year 2020. Millage remains at 8 mills, with 7 mills for general purposes, and 1 mill for appropriations to the Volunteer Fire Company. The motion was made by Mrs. McClelland, seconded by Mr. Matlos and passed unanimously.

ENGINEER GLENN'S REPORT. – Mr. Prince, Engineer, reporting.

There was nothing to report.

OLD BUSINESS.

Mr. Zrenchak informed public that we have several board openings due to various reasons and are going to advertise for letters of interest. He said we have two openings for the planning board and two openings for the zoning board. Mr. Zrenchak said that if anyone was interested to please submit a letter to the borough office to be considered.

NEW BUSINESS.

Mr. Zrenchak informed public that we have vacancy for the Chairman of the Vacancy Board. He said if anyone was interested to put in a letter of interest to be considered.

Mr. Zrenchak called for a motion to advertise for the planning, zoning, and vacancy board positions. The motion was made by Mrs. Matyasovsky, seconded by Mrs. McClelland and passed unanimously.

CORRESPONDENCE.

Mr. Zrenchak called for a motion to accept typed minutes from the Regular Session on December 11, 2019 and the continuation on December 26, 2019. The motion was made by Mr. Matlos, seconded by Mrs. Matyasovsky. Mrs. Matyasovsky, yes; Mr. Sloss, yes; Mr. Matlos, yes; Mr. Zrenchak, yes; Mrs. McClelland, no, she explained she was voting no because she was not in attendance of those meetings; Mr. Gretz, no and Mrs. Lape, no. It was a 4-3 vote, motion carried.

The next meeting date and time will be on Wednesday, February 12, 2020. The workshop session will be at 6:00 pm. The regular session is at 7:30 pm. Mr. Zrenchak called for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Mrs. McClelland, seconded by Mr. Matlos and passed unanimously.
