### The Retired Clergy writes

Hello Everyone,

"Reasons to be cheerful", summer is here, Covid is receding and the process for finding a new Rector is well underway. There is everything to look forward to, but no one should be left behind.

Bereavement has many depths and is expressed in different ways. Particularly cruel, was bereavement during the Covid years: deprived of the usual respectful funerals and celebrations of loved ones' lives. Being able to move forward, sometimes needs a little extra help. Our villages take seriously their proper concern for bereaved neighbours in providing practical support and a listening ear, but during Covid our established Bereavement Group, otherwise known as "Be café", had to be suspended because it involved a group of vulnerable people, meeting indoors. I am pleased to say that the doors of Be café are open from this month.

The midweek Holy Communion service was also suspended during Covid. This was an important service, caring and catering for the spiritual and social needs of those who found being able to sit throughout the service, on comfortable chairs, followed by homemade cakes, coffee and conversation with real people, more accessible than Sunday services. Now I can say that this service is reinstated once a month.

Jesus was concerned about caring for the social, emotional, and spiritual needs of people at all stages of life and death. He is the one constant in an ever-changing world.

### CONGRATULATIONS TO HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II ON HER PLATINUM JUBILEE

The residents of Alveley and Romsley would like to extend their congratulations and very best wishes on this historic milestone. To celebrate the occasion throughout the Spring and Summer residents are being encouraged to send their congratulations by "SAYING IT IN FLOWERS", with displays of RED,WHITE and BLUE blooms. This applies across private gardens, public spaces, village organisations, including Alveley School, St Mary's Church, Recreation Association, Village Hall, Old Chapel, Alveley Medical Practice, Severn Valley Country Park, the Community Hall and the local public houses.

In addition to "Saying It in Flowers" we will be staging events to add to the unique occasion.

The following details are an overview of these events and there may be slight amendments before the Jubilee Weekend but the overall structure will remain in place.

On the first day of the weekend, **THURSDAY JUNE 2<sup>nd</sup> at 9.45pm a Jubilee Beacon will be lit at Romsley** .This will be one of more than 1500 beacons throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories, and one in each of the capital cities of Commonwealth countries in recognition of our Queen's long and selfless service. The beacons will enable local communities, individuals and organisations to pay tribute to Her Majesty as part of the official Jubilee Weekend.

#### A peal of bells will ring out from St. Mary's at 9.45pm.

**FIREWORKS** We are also holding a firework display on the Sports Club field. However this will just be an aerial display of fireworks (i.e. nothing at ground level) which will be viewed from the Recreation Ground in order to maximise safety. **This display** will follow the lighting of the beacon and **will begin just before 10pm.** 

Please note that **parking will be limited and that stewards will be on duty** to guide and help. Please note also that there will be **no public access to the sports field.** 

On the final day of the weekend **SUNDAY JUNE 5<sup>th</sup>** the recreation field will be open from 12 noon. **Bring your picnic and drinks** – there will be a bar in the Pavilion. Tea and coffee will be served in the Village Hall.

**BUNCH** who will be playing popular and classic hits from across the decades, starting at 12.30pm until 2.30 approximately.

#### Celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee

Dudmaston Hall in Quatt will celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee from Sunday, 29 May to Sunday, 5 June (excluding Saturday) with a week of royal fun.

There will be family game stations in the grounds with a Queen Elizabeth II trivia trail, with games similar to ones enjoyed by children in the 1950s available for making new family memories. **Hart of the Wood** Visit Comer Woods on 25 June for a day of folk art and culture, exploring humanity's relationship with the woods.

Hart of the Wood is a bold new multidisciplinary, multimodal art and film project, led by artist and filmmaker Benjamin Wigley, that celebrates humanity's ingrained relationship with the woods. The project's capacious branches envelope an ambitious range of art forms that include: a long-form avant-garde documentary film, outdoor expanded cinema live event, kinetoscope hand-crank celluloid film projection sculptures, and an exhibition of handmade celluloid film prints, paintings, and projections.

Benjamin Wigley has been working with a team of artists on this pioneering project at Dudmaston's Comer Woods. This project was originally conceived to mark the 40th Anniversary of the property coming under the care of the National Trust. However, because of the pandemic the project was delayed and, over time, has evolved into an inspiring collection of works exploring ideas around the multitude of ways people can immerse themselves in an idea or story.

So the team creating this event are hoping for **volunteers** to get involved in different ways including stewarding the event, helping to build installations in the woods over the two days before the Saturday event, supporting performers, guiding people to keep them on the path or supervising the exhibition.

### THE DAY I MET H.M. QUEEN ELIZABETH AND H.R.H. PRINCE PHILIP

In February 1979 Her Majesty The Queen and H.R.H. Prince Philip paid an official visit to Dubai during their tour of the United Arab Emirates. At that time I was working in the British Embassy in Dubai. I arrived early at the embassy that morning in order to help check and re-check all the details of the visit, then I went home to change into the pretty dress I had bought especially for the occasion.

The Embassy is situated at the side of Dubai Creek and on my return the road between the Creek and the Embassy was packed with schoolchildren who had been brought in on highly decorated buses. I spent some time moving amongst them chatting and handing out hundreds of small Union Jack flags.

The Royal party arrived in the Sheikh's barge. They spent 15 minutes amongst the children before coming up into the Embassy grounds where the staff were all lined up. Her Majesty thanked me for all the hard work that she said she knew went into the organisation of her tours. I then shook hands and exchanged a few words with Prince Philip. When they had met everyone in the garden, the Queen and Prince Philip moved indoors to the long dining room where certain people were to have private interviews and receive gifts. I was one of those people. I was last to go in, after being told by a senior Naval officer how I should walk in, curtsey and wait to be spoken to. The room had never seemed longer than it did that day! The Queen chatted to me for a few minutes about life in Dubai and then presented me with a brooch. Prince Philip then joined in the conversation and asked me if I would like a signed photograph of them both which he was holding out to me. After a few more minutes I backed out through the side door leading back out into the garden. The Queen and Prince Philip came back into the garden and mingled amongst the staff for a short while longer before taking their leave of us.

That evening we had all been invited to a reception on board the Royal Yacht Britannia. That night I wore a beautiful full-length gown made of cream coloured old fashioned-lace. When I boarded, as I dropped my curtsey the Queen said: 'Good evening, Susan. How many times is this today?' I replied 'Three ma'am.'

The reception was wonderful. The royal party moved amongst the guests until it was time to watch the Beating of the Retreat by the band of the Royal Marines. A British contractor had erected stands on the quayside with seating for hundreds of people. When the band struck up with Hearts of Oak, The British Grenadiers, Rule Britannia etc the crowd sang along at the tops of their voices - as we all did on the yacht. The atmosphere was electric. It was a most wonderful evening – indeed, a most wonderful day and one which I shall remember for the rest of my life. *Sue France, 15 Peacock Hill, Alveley.*

### **ALVELEY STROLLERS & STRIDERS**

The footpaths around the centre of Alveley continue to be improved making them more accessible for more people (and dogs). The tree trunks leaning across the footpath leading from Cooks Cross to the allotments were a danger to everyone who used this path. I'm pleased to say that they have now been cut off and removed which means we no longer have to bend double to crawl under them, or in some cases banging our heads on them - some of us have found out the hard way exactly how hard tree trunks can be!

Continuing the process of replacing stiles with kissing gates in the vicinity of the village, two more gates have now been installed on the footpath connecting the village to Romsley Lane, the Bowhills bridleway, and Bowhills Dingle. This coincides with the refurbishment of the path up the side of the old garage building development on the other side of the A442, and creates a much improved access to a lovely area to the East of Alveley.

Regarding Roms**ley** and Alve**ley**, I have read that all the local Anglo-Saxon place names ending in '**ley'** were once leys or clearings in the ancient Forest of Morfe which covered the whole area between Kinver to the East and the Wyre forest to the West. Nordley Regis, or Kingsnordley as we now know it, was to the North of Alveley (and I suspect that Astley was so named because it was to the East). I have also read that in 1376 Margaret de Astley, whose family owned Nordley manor house, married Roger De la Lee (**Ley**?) of Coton Hall. After their marriage they lived in Coton which had, even then, belonged to the De la Lee's for some 800 years. The Coton Hall with which we are familiar was built in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century by their descendant Harry Lancelot Lee. Incidentally the old chapel ruin in front of Coton Hall is thought to date from the 13<sup>th</sup> century.

### ALVELEY VILLAGE BAND


The Birmingham Botanical Gardens will be hosting our second public event of this year on Sunday June 19th at 2pm..

### **ALVELEY HISTORY**


"The Battle of Alveley" and "Alveley News"

After 12 months of research I have finally managed to document the sequence of events that led to the 1645 Civil War Battle on the outskirts of the village and the possible battle site. Together with photographs and maps the book is priced at £5.00 and finally dispels the many myths that have built up over the generations that the battle took place in the churchyard.

The second book is a collection of over 100 newspaper reports dating from the late 1700s through to the 1960s which detail daily life in Alveley and Romsley Parish including reports on murders, suicides, riots, accidents, theft and a prize fight at Tuck Hill where the reporter refers to the spectators as "savages from the Black Country"!
