


Retire with Joy* with Roberta Gregoire Monday, March 16 6:00pm




Anyone picking up materials for someone else **must have the patron's card, or a copy of their card**, to check out items for privacy reasons.

In 1918, the U.S. Army Signal Corps sent 223 women to France at General Pershing's explicit request. These women were all masters of the latest technology: the telephone switchboard. While suffragettes picketed the White House and President Wilson struggled to persuade a segregationist Congress to give women of all races the vote, these courageous young women swore the army oath and settled into their new roles. Elizabeth Cobbs reveals the challenges they faced in a war zone where male soldiers wooed, mocked, and, ultimately, celebrated them.






