Free Tax Help: Fridays, February 6 & 20, March 6 & 20, 10am-1pm

Due to popular demand, there will be free tax preparations for individuals on Fridays, February 6 & 20 as well as March 6 & 20 (weather dependent), from 10:00 am to 1 pm at the library. IRS -tax law certified volunteers will be here to help with electronic filing for all people who qualify.

Interested persons can walk-in any time during those hours; there may be a waiting line and preparers will work on a first-come, first-served basis. If the walk-in limit has been reached before noon, individuals will be able to do a "drop-off" of their information, which will be returned to the library on Monday, either the 9th or 23rd of each month..

Tax preparers will meet with taxpayers to answer questions, prepare returns, and review that federal and state tax returns are accurate prior to e-filing. The process typically takes approximately 45 minutes.

Taxpayers should bring proof of Identification (photo ID); Social Security cards or Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITIN) for you, your spouse, and/or dependents; proof of foreign status, if applying for an ITIN; birthdates for all on the tax return; for married filing jointly, both spouses must be present; all Forms W-2, W-2G, 1099 and 1098; a copy of last year's federal and state returns; proof of bank account and routing information if choosing direct deposit of refund (e.g. voided check); total paid to day-care provider and their tax ID; health insurance exemption certificate, if received; and all Forms 1095 Health Insurance statements. A reminder that WPL offers a few free tax forms.

This Humanities Nebraska workshop is specifically created to incite the imagination and enhance the writing skills of young people. It combines photographic images and discussion of ten Nebraska birds, their songs, a couple of dances, small photographs of each bird for participants, and coloring-book pictures of the birds with a number of creative writing activities focused primarily on information and ideas emphasized—size, colors, sounds, action, etc. will be focused on. Writing activities emphasize the use of descriptive language and a variety of poetic devices. Students will share their work class and revise their efforts to create vivid images.


