How to make your project a success.

Prior to Bidding

- Read the plans completely
- Understand everyone's role
- If there are liquidated damages, be sure you understand them
- As the prime contractor you are the ultimate responsible party for this project

Role of the FDOT

- Make sure all work is done according to specifications
- Make sure the contractor is performing according to the contract.
- They are not the contractor of record you as the prime are, the project is your responsibility.

After the Contract Award

- Mobilization costs
 - Will you need a loan?
 - Will you need to hire another crew?
- Out of area projects impose bring additional costs and considerations
 - Housing and food for crew
 - Prices may differ from those of your normal supplier
- Start the project on time!!
 - If you start the project late you are more likely to finish late this could but not always have additional costs.

After the Start of the Project

- Additional work outside of scope
 - Could but not always add time and possibly cost
- Communicate with FDOT staff
 - One reason some projects fail is poor communications
- District offices have staff who can help
 - FDOT wants you to succeed

Finish on Time

- Allow time for the final inspection
 - Plan to finish early to allow for corrections
- When you finish a project on time it could start you on the road to success.

Tips for Completing the Project Successfully

- Know what you have bid on.
- Know the cost and schedule.
- Understand your role as the prime.
- Understand cash flow.
- Understand mobilization and its cost.
- Start on the day you are supposed to start.

Completing the Project Successfully

- If you fall behind:
 - Keep FDOT informed.
 - Try to mobilize additional crews.
- Allow time for the final inspection and correction of any items that do not conform to project specification.
- Maintain documentation as the project progresses.
