

Artist of the Month



There were three expressions I chose for a working life: Artistry, Ministry and Social Work..they merged for me. It was a good run, Two years ago I retired. Artistry was the solid choice for continuation. It is a wonderful choice. Having spent more time in formal education learning how, what and why to paint . It is a fit. Painting for 63 years out of 67 the choice of what and how to paint has been all over the place..different styles and subjects. All the Art instructors and their guidance was a treasure. There were three that had the greatest impact. Thankyou to Sue Erwin, a beloved long time mentor, Rama Rao (painter/professor, India), who insisted on "Bright Color" and Richard Mantia, beloved by all his students.

It was in 2019 that a solid "voice" emerged for the content of each related painting hanging in the gallery today. The series of paintings depict the future for our planet, her inhabitants and space with a dash of metaphoric spice. The inspiration for each painting typically comes from a worship setting with me sitting in a pew and not standing behind a lectern. Someone else is speaking of the conversations between humankind and the Great Creator while I'm busy in the pew with pen and a sketchpad. The thumbnail sketches are sweet. Many depict female astronauts and some sort of space craft; however, the secret is in the makeup of the crafts. Each imaginative ship seems made from the "stuff 'found in junkyards, garbage dumps and curio shops. The inference, future generations will use the refuse from such places instead of the further mining of the earth 's resources for the raw materials. Upcycling to make the future goods and yes, that is already happening!

There is a process to arrive at the finished oil paintings. It begins with the thumbnail sketch. Next, using high end magazine glossy advertisements I fashion paper art pieces with bits of paper objects recreating a reflection of the thumbnail sketch. It is like assembling a jigsaw puzzle. Using the finished paper piece as a template the large oil painting makes the grander statement of it's






