Hogares Providencia recently celebrated the 40th anniversary of their founding. Over that time, they have transformed the lives of hundreds of vulnerable children and adolescents. These kids, who have been removed from their family homes because of extreme poverty, neglect, or abuse, are now thriving at Hogares Providencia thanks to the care and attention they receive.

The organization faces rising costs for such basics as groceries and utilities as well as the modest salaries paid to the children's caregivers. In response to these needs, Hogares Providencia has launched a fundraising campaign among their supporters in Mexico and the United States called "súmate al millón" or "be one in a million". The *million* refers to their goal of raising 1,000,000 pesos, or approximately \$50,000, during the campaign.

### **Learning and Playing at Summer School**

El Puente de Esperanza offers a program that provides educational and personal growth opportunities to young men and women who come from families with limited economic resources. Most come from rural and indigenous communities where there are no secondary schools or universities.

The students of El Puente, thankful for the generosity they have received, give back by sponsoring a summer school program for the children in one of their hometowns. In July of this year, the course will take place in San Ildefonso in southern Querétaro State with the theme of play-based learning. It will include classes in science, robotics, sports, dance, chess and ecology.



One noteworthy aspect of this year's course is that the director of the host school is a former beneficiary of El Puente! The community will provide a site for the event.

The contributions of our donors will allow us to pay the costs of program materials, transportation, and meals. We appreciate your support of this educational project for the kids in a rural town.

### **Storytime for Migrant Children**

Yo'on Ixim ("heart of corn" in the Mayan Tsotsil language) is located in Puebla and operates a school there to serve the children of internal migrants who moved to that city from their home communities in Chiapas to seek work. About 90% of these indigenous migrants communicate using their native language and do not speak Spanish. A primary goal of the organization is to see that these kids have access to a bilingual and intercultural education and reach the academic targets appropriate for their age.

space for learning and creativity on the streets where the children live. This program takes place in three locations, including the children's hometown in Chiapas, allowing it to reach more kids. Yo'on Ixim's bilingual and multi-cultural publications are a cornerstone of this project. Because of this project's mobility, they can reach kids not currently enrolled in the Yo'on Ixim school. This effort also involves participation from Tsotsil community workers across the city of Puebla.
