Biography

David W. Nutt, age 93, of Bad Axe, passed away on Monday, April 18, 2016. David was born in Filion on July 25, 1922, son of the late Melburn and Margaret (Johnston) Nutt. He married Bernadette Gosdzinski on June 3, 1957. She preceded him in death on June 14, 1994. David served in the U.S. Army in the WWII Pacific Theater from 1943 to 1945. He was part of the 40th Division, HQ Company, 187 Infantry, serving as an M7 medium tank driver earning the rank of Tech 5. He took part in several battles and campaigns including New Guinea, Bismarck Archipelago, Southern Philippines and Luzon. He earned numerous awards including the Combat Infantry Badge, Bronze Star, WWII Victory Medal, American Theater Ribbon, Asiatic-Pacific Ribbon with four Bronze Battle Stars, Bronze Service Arrowhead, Philippine Liberation Ribbon with one Bronze Star, three Overseas Service Bars and a Good Conduct Medal. He was a member of the Bad Axe VFW Post 116 and the Thumb Veterans Organization.
