#### The Reverend's Ruminations - May 2024

Wow, where did April go? I kind of thought that since we celebrated Easter on the final day of March, April would slow down and allow us to catch our breath. Unfortunately, that didn't start out quite the way I'd hoped. The pace of my Holy Week activities and commitments must have wom me down and made my body susceptible to infection by the COVID-19 virus throughout the week following Easter. It's still hard to tell where we might encounter this insidious bug among our travels and interactions, but it's still out there!. The results were at least a little milder than the last time I had it in August of 2022. Luckily(?) I was already planning to attend a 4-day Air National Guard drill the first weekend of April, and had arranged with Jen Kahler to preach in my absence... I just didn't realize that I'd be sick at home and missing that too!?! I will need to make up those 4 days, but will try not to let that impact my ministries here to the best of my ability.

By the time you read this, we will have confirmed three young ladies into full membership with our congregation, and on May 19th will recognize two of our young men who will be graduating from high school in the days ahead. We'll also be thanking our Christian Education crew that Sunday for their tireless efforts to ensure a great season of Sunday School. It's hard to believe that summer is quickly approaching, but stay tuned for information regarding Vacation Bible School, camp opportunities, and likely some special fellowship/leaming activities for members and friends of all ages in the months ahead!

Over the last month or so, we encountered an issue where our church's online domain name somehow expired without our knowledge (or warning from the provider). We apologize for the inconvenience of our website becoming unavailable, but have just regained ownership of the fairmontucc.org domain name and are now beginning work on what we hope will actually be an improved version of this important resource for timely and accurate information about our church. April may have passed without much "fanfare" in terms of church holidays, but our continued observation of the Easter season throughout the fifty days following the glorious celebration of Christ's Easter resurrection is an important annual part of our faith journey. As my sermons since Easter have followed the recollections on the early church's activities found in the book of Acts, the continuing Sundays "of Easter" are intended as a reminder that the gift of God's only begotten Son is not just a momentary party, but an opportunity for continued growth and connection to Jesus' selfless sacrifice on the Cross.

The church's season of Easter concludes with the mysterious and powerful arrival of the Holy Spirit on **Pentecost Sunday**—this year observed on May 19<sup>th</sup>. It is often referred to as the "birthday of the church," the moment at which the disciples are endowed with both the mission and the power to go out into all the world to spread the gospel message.

You probably remember much of the story: The disciples are all gathered again in an upper room, having fellowship with one another, but also wondering "what next?" Suddenly, they hear the voice of God, and each of them understands it in their own language. They also see the presence of God in fire, not the burning bush Moses once saw, but tongues of fire above their heads. And the voice of God says to them, "You can't stay here in this place; you must go out far and wide into the world, to teach and heal." Called and empowered by God's Word and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, they went out to lead people from separation to oneness — truly the birthday of the church and the example by which we are to minister in this broken and hurting world around us today.

So beyond an occasion to wear red to church on May 19, what significance does Pentecost have on our Christian lives? Well, we're called to cultivate a conversation — with God and with others! Prayer should be a constant in your life, but if it's not as frequent as it should be, now is the time to respond to that "still small voice" that you (much like the first disciples) are hearing in the unique language of your own life. God wants to hear from you and have you respond when spoken to! And once you've opened up your prayer life, it is your opportunity to engage with others. That doesn't have to mean an awkward, out-of-the-blue theological discussion with a stranger in the local convenience store! It could be as simple as more time spent with a young family member, a little extra engagement with a neighbor down the street, or offering a hand of welcome and invitation to a friend you haven't seen in awhile. As our UCC denomination is fond of saving, "God is still speaking." Will you listen and respond?

The Council met in Heritage Hall at 6:00 PM. Moderator Kay Campe called the meeting to order, and Pastor Cory led in prayer. The confirmands were introduced, and we took a moment to "celebrate generosity" for the confirmands and their faith journey.

Motion to approve the minutes from the meeting on March 20, 2024 was M/S/C (Larry Lasch/Abigail Anderson).

#### Hy-Vee & Fareway Report as of of 21 April 2024

During the last 4 weeks, \$15,997.74 (8.00%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 20 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$81,076.19 (40.54%) toward the 17<sup>th</sup> goal which is now \$200,000.

During the same time, \$5,067.61 (3.38%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 55 weeks, Fareway is at \$63,057.78 (42.04%) toward our  $5^{th}$  \$150,000 goal.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Even slips from Hy-Vee Fast & Fresh (Gas), Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Delivery slips/ sheets can also be used. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the Church, or mailing them or dropping them off at my house.

Sarcastic platitudes don't quite cut it anymore, and you may feel as if your life is going off the rails.

**Not What I Signed Up For** is more than just an exasperated phrase you may find yourself screaming, alone in your car; it's a video study you should check out this month on **rightnow** MEDIA:

## Strawberry Fello-Pretzel Dessert

1 lb strawberries 8 oz cool whip 3/4 cup sugar 2 1/2 cups pretzels 1 stick butter 8 oz cream cheese 6 oz strawberry jello 2 cups water

- Pre-heat oven to 350° F. Combine Strawberry Jello with 2 cups boiling water and stir until completely dissolved. Set aside to cool to room temperature.
- Crush 2 1/2 cups of pretzels in sturdy Ziploc bag, using a rolling pin. Pretzels should be broken into bite size pieces.
- In a medium pan, melt 8 Tbsp butter then add 1/4 cup sugar and stir. Mix in crushed
  pretzels until they are evenly coated. Transfer to a 13x9 glass casserole dish, pressing
  the pretzel mix evenly over the bottom of the dish and bake for 10 min at 350°. Remove
  from oven and cool to room temperature.
- While pretzel mix is cooling, use a hand mixer to beat 8 oz cream cheese and 1/2 cup sugar on med/high speed until mixture is fluffy and white. Fold in 8 oz Cool Whip until no streaks of cream cheese remain. Spread mixture over cooled pretzels, making sure to go all the way to the edges of the dish to create a seal. (you do not want the jello to leak on the pretzels.) Put dish in the refrigerator for 30 mins.
- Clean and slice 1 lb fresh strawberries and stir them into your room temperature Jello.
   Poor and spread strawberry Jello mixture evenly over your cooled cream cheese layer and refrigerate until it is set. (approx 2 4 hours)
- · Cut into squares and enjoy!
