Ministry Areas in Action

WORSH

During the fall guarter Worship continued both online and in person as we celebrated Reformation, All Saints' Sunday, Advent, and Christmas. Through our Facebook live streaming of worship services we shared Shiner Lutheran with an around 300 views each week. We were blessed with Vicar Daniel as a collaborative

learner and his wife Mallory as a musician. Dedicated leaders worked behind the scenes to continue both in person and online worship, adapting and changing as needed. Despite the failure of a sound system component and the inability to procure a replacement due to CoVid delays, our worship team succeeded in proviing a setting where members and friends could worship in person and virtually.





Learning during the fall guarter continued Sunday and Wednesday morning adult classes. Our Wednesday evening GIFT program looked different with meals served on to go plates and with as much distancing as possible. Two Godly Play classes met in the sanctuary where there was more room to socially distance the students. The GIFT adult class finished one book and began studying other faiths and denominations. Emma Davis and William Stock were confirmed in October and became full members. Unfortunately, the planned modified Christmas program was canceled due to increased CoVid pressure and GIFT did not meet in December.



Learning



Hospitality is usually one of our most active groups. In this pandemic year, many hospitality supported events could not take place. Our hospitality team began meeting again during the fall quarter. This group packed away kitchen items and prepared the cabi-OVE nets for the next stage of renovations. This group also spon-

sored the Giving Tree, gathering gifts for needy families at Christmas. They arranged a cake and punch reception for the confirmands. Noisy Offerings continued in fall, giv-



ing to Lutheran World Relief, St. Nicholas Ministry, and Shiner Community Food Pantry. Fall brought the return of preparing breakfast once a month for the Food Pantry ministry at the Methodist Church. Before Christmas, efforts were made to minister to the homebound by offering home communion to that group to supplement the Home Touch mail ministry that reaches out each month. Fellowship groups did not meet in fall.



During fall quarter, the impact of our live Facebook streaming continued. Hundreds of online viewers joined worship each week. A set back came at the end of September when a major component in our sound system failed. Due to the pandemic, no replacement units were available until late Decem-

ber. Nevertheless, our volunteers patched together a sound system that could be used during these months. January should bring the resolution of issues and allow our hearing impaired units to be used again. Our church website has been offline for many months. A team of volunteers worked on designing a new website with up to date information. Wink's Tech Solutions built that website and it was launched in December. At www.shinerlutheran.org we now have a working website that is more visitor friendly and links to our calendar, publications, and giving.



Ministries Areas in Action



Our support team kept our facility and finances functioning through the fall months. Events that were able to meet, such as GIFT and Bible studies, meant timely cleaning and sanitizing had to be implemented. The property team sponsored a Clean Up Day in November, when volunteers raked and bagged leaves. The first part of the kitchen update was completed and cabinets were built offsite for the next phase of the renovation. Our internet and streaming issues continued, and our volunteers Property did troubleshooting. The next step is to gather information on hardwiring our internet connection from the office to the sanctuary. A staff addition was made in November to fill the part-time position of Office

Assistant that had been vacant since the end of May. Sandy Machacek assumed this position, bringing with her years of office experience, life-long knowledge of our congregation, and a joyful heart. Together our staff and volunteers work

together to be faithful, responsible support for our congregation.

Because of the months that we did not meet in person, Noisy Offering was collected for just seven months in 2020. During the fall quarter we gave to Lutheran World Relief (\$109.23), St. Nicholas Ministry,(\$129.22)

and the Shiner Community food Pantry (\$188.59). Every penny counts in this monthly giving.



Our Little Caesar's Pizza Kit Fundraisers have been able to continue even during the pandemic. Our winter pizza sale runs through January 24 with delivery of the kits the week of February 8. We need to sell 100 kits to avoid a delivery charge; we earn \$6 for each item sold.

Funds raised go to support our youth. Selections this sale are limited due to pandemic set backs. Even though these pizza kits and cookie dough are more basic, they still taste great!



At our semi-annual congregational meeting in November, the 2021 budget was approved. Overall, the General Fund operating budget was reduced to \$221,640.00, a figure that is inline with the 2016 General Fund Operating Budget. Of course, the Building Loan portion of the budget remains at \$132,033.36.

We continue to align our budget categories with our church operating model and also with the greater church. The "Benevolence" label now becomes "Mission Support." \$12,900.00 is set aside for Mission Support in the 2021 budget.

"Clergy Salary Etc." includes the pastor's salary and benefits, the Vicar's salary and benefits, supply ministers, mileage, and pastoral continuing education for a total of \$115,138.00.

"Staff Salary Etc." covers the salaries and social security expenses for six part-time staff positions and supply musicians for a total of \$43,937.00.

Our "Ministries" category is budgeted \$8,000.00 and includes our mission groups areas of Worship, Learning, Service and Witness.

The "Support & Administration" category includes stewardship envelopes, office supplies, postage and equipment as well as telephones, utilities for church and parsonage, pest control, building insurance and maintenance. This comprehensive area is budgeted for \$41,665.00 for 2021.

During the uncertain times of 2020, we had some expenses that may have been lower due to reduced programming, but salaries and operating expenses remained. Each month we fell around \$3,000 short on building fund contributions, but we did have funds in reserve to cover that shortfall. Overall, our faithful contributors and special giving continued to support the ministry of our congregation.

The complete 2021 approved budget will be included in the 2020 Annual Report.

Looking to the Coming Months

The past three months have continued to be a challenge as we continue to gather both in person and online for worship. Although we have moved with an abundance of caution out of concern and respect for those most at risk, ministries have begun to adapt and change as pandemic conditions change. Like spring and summer of 2020, some of our fall quarter traditions did not take place. Yet the church continued being church: worshiping both in person and online, celebrating milestones like confirmation, baptisms, weddings, and being present as much as possible for the end of life.



Looking ahead to the next three months:



In some ways we begin January looking back at the year that just ended. By the middle of January the 2020 contribution statements will be sent to those who make contributions of record. The 2020 Annual Report will be published and can be picked up at worship or in the Gathering Place during the last weeks of January. Our congrega-

tional meeting to review the report is scheduled for Sunday January 31 immediately following worship. Looking back helps us evaluate what has been. At the same time, we look forward to the fresh start and renewed vigor that comes with a new beginning.

We begin on January 3 with a special Epiphany service of light. On January 10th, the 2020 Church Council will be installed during worship. Plans are for GIFT Wednesdays to resume on January 13.



Although February is the shortest month of the year, it brings change and opportunity. Usually the first Saturday in February is our Bluebonnet Conference Equipping the Saints gathering; this year may bring changes or adaptations to this event. Mission Groups plan to gather on February 7 after church, once again working together. February 14 is Valentine's Day-we hope to be able to have a special event that day to encourage people we

love. Sunday February 14 is also Transfiguration, a festival day in the church year that marks the end of Epiphany. Ash Wednesday on February 17 involves the imposition of ashes and a special worship service. Lent begins and we will set time aside for our weekly Wednesday evening services during the weeks leading to Easter.





March will blow in with the start of spring and hope of new beginnings as we mark a year since the first pandemic major shutdowns. We will make the time change as we spring ahead on March 14 and enter into the longer days that come with Daylight Savings time. We will take a

break from most schedules as schools take a week in The middle of March for spring break. During March, our Lenten journey continues with special Wednesday evening worship services. This year Holy Week begins on March 28 with Palm Sunday, marking the beginning of the final journey to the cross and

the resurrection. In the midst of darkness, we have hope.
