

HOW TO DEAL WITH HOLIDAY WASTE CORRECTLY





Air Pillows & Bubble Wrap
Deflate air pillows and put them with
bubble wrap in the plastic bag recycling
bin at the grocery store. You also can ask
at local shipping stores to see if they can
take it.





PRE-MADE BOWS/FABRIC AND CURLING RIBBONS CAN BE REUSED, NOT RECYCLED!



Styrofoam blocks can be dropped off at the Recology Store. There is a fee for non-customers. They do not accept packing peanuts.







Be sure that the cardboard is dry, clean and broken down into the allowable size. They can be put in the recycling bin.

CARDS

You can recycle cards if you remove anything that is not regular paper (flocked, metallic, foil or laminated). Repurpose anything not recyclable. Card stock can be repurposed and made into a gift tag.



Envelopes can be recycled if you remove the foil lining.

Plastic Christmas trees can be taken to thrift stores or gifted to someone looking for a tree.



REAL TREES CAN BE CUT UP IN 4- OR 6-FT SECTIONS (DEPENDING ON VENDOR) AND PLACED IN A YARD WASTE BIN.



SOME SCOUT TROOPS RECYCLE REAL CHRISTMAS TREES AND MAKE THEM INTO COMPOST

BUBBLE WRAP MAILERS WITH PLASTIC ENVELOPES CAN BE RECYCLED WHEREVER YOU RETURN PLASTIC BAGS.

Bubble wrap mailers with paper envelopes cannot be recycled.



SOME HARDWARE STORES (MCLENDON'S & ACE) RECYCLE INDOOR, OUTDOOR & TREE CHRISTMAS LIGHTS





ORNAMENTS CAN BE GIFTED OR TAKEN TO A THRIFT STORE OR REPURPOSE THEM AS DECORATIONS ON GIFTS



REMOVE WIRE/DECORATIONS FROM WREATH & PLACE PLANT MATTER IN YARD WASTE. REUSE ANY WIRE OR DECORATIONS.



OUTDOOR CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS CAN BE TAKEN TO A THRIFT SHOP
