

Confession of Our Faith—a Summary of Reformation Confessions

The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) strongly condemns idolatry and superstition, viewing them as sins that corrupt true faith by displacing God with lesser things. Both concepts are understood broadly, extending far beyond the literal worship of statues to encompass any misplaced trust or focus. The PC(USA) defines idolatry not only as the worship of statues or false gods but as the act of giving one's ultimate allegiance to anything other than the Creator. This can include both material and abstract things. The PC(USA) also rejects superstition as a deviation from genuine faith, seeing it as a corruption of worship. Superstitious practices obscure the recognition of God's true nature and divert focus from a direct relationship with the divine.

First Scripture Reading

Ephesians 2:1-10

As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, ² in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient.³ All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our flesh and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature deserving of wrath. 4 But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, 5 made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. ⁶ And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, ⁷ in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. 8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith - and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - 9 not by works, so that no one can boast. 10 For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.
