

A brick chimney rises from the roof ridge at the rear. A pedimented-gable wall dormer juts from the center of the west wall and extends 1 1/2 stories. A hipped-gable, enclosed porch covers the front gable end. The coursed, ashlar foundation contains recessed, 2 light, awning windows. All other windows are replace-

History and Significance This house post-dates the original residence of John Stokes, Jr. An historic photograph of the Stokes Winery shows that, like many similar facilities of the period, it was a combined residence and cellar. It is no longer standing. Mr. Stokes was born at Munster, Ireland, in 1828 and immigrated to

His second son Norman, born on K.I. in 1886, married island girl, Pauline Kurtz, and worked many years for the KILT Co. |
