Greetings from your Parish Nurse.

As you know, my brother-in-law continues to recover slowly from a stem cell transplant. Going through this process with Ron and my sister has been amazing. All the frustration and confusion in dealing with the medical community to even get a diagnosis. Then the difficulty of being approved for the next steps and all the arrangements that had to be made including finding housing in Minnesota for 4 months. It hasn't been easy.

But through it all, watching them having to navigate the emotional ups and downs of a long process has been amazing. My sister texted me last week with this thought. "At the lab yesterday, Ron and a stranger, who was waiting for his wife with a serious brain tumor, briefly shared their stories. In parting the man shared, 'Everyday when I wake up, I have a choice. I can choose faith and light or...fear and darkness.' Don't we all make that choice in our difficult times? Ron and I choose faith and light!"

Isn't there a profound truth in those words? All of us have a choice each day when we wake up. Yes, Ron and this stranger may be more aware of the choice before them because of their circumstances. But all of us have many choices each day and in every part of our lives. We have choices about how to spend our money and how to spend our time. We have choices about who we choose to "hang out" with and where we look for connections to other people. We have choices about what we listen to and read, and what we believe and act on.

But, perhaps most importantly, we have choices to make about our attitude in every situation. We can choose to be discouraged or frustrated when things are not going our way. Or we can choose to look at those setbacks as another opportunity to grow. We can give grace to ourselves and others as we make missteps or have conflicts and choose to reconcile rather than hold on to the pain and anger. We can wallow in self-pity about our circumstances, or we can choose to be thankful and begin to change our lives in little or big ways. The important thing is: We do have a choice.

So what will you choose today? Faith and light and joy or darkness and fear? Be willing to take an honest look at yourself and your actions/attitudes. Where is God prompting you to change and make a different choice. Ask Him to help you. He will!


