Montessori Academy is one of the leading Montessori schools in the nation. Accreditation is an important assurance of a quality education and an authentic Montessori environment. Accreditation with the American Montessori Society (AMS) and AdvancEd (formerly known as SACS CASI) is a high priority. With 1,300 member schools, the American Montessori Society includes 163 schools that are fully accredited with AMS, approximately 29 of these schools are also accredited by AdvancEd. Montessori Academy is the only Montessori school in Middle Tennessee that is accredited by the AMS and AdvancEd; it is one of two Montessori schools in Tennessee accredited by both the AMS and AdvancEd. Montessori Academy is the academic leader in the Middle Tennessee region in Montessori education and is a not-for-profit family-operated school.

Montessori Academy's historical roots began at the first Montessori school in Nashville, when the founder, Mrs. Eileen Bernstorf, assisted a neighbor in starting Montessori Centre in 1967. In 1985, she began Montessori Academy on the current 24-acre wooded campus. The first of five buildings was completed in 1986 and now with over 50,000 square feet under roof, Montessori Academy offers an excellent educational experience for Infant (3 months - 18 months), Toddler (18 months - 36 months), Primary (ages 3-6), Lower Elementary (ages 6-9), and Upper Elementary/Middle School (ages 9-15) students.

Application and Enrollment Procedure

A Campus tour by parents is the first step of the admission process. Application may then be made by submitting a completed application form and the application fee. Each age level has the following specific requirements before a student may enroll:

Toddler (18 months - 36 months) - Parents must complete an application and questionnaire. Your child will then be placed in our wait pool. Because we seek balanced classrooms in both age and gender, we have a "wait pool" rather than a conventional wait list. When a possible space opens for your child, an interview and classroom visit will be scheduled, and the parents will be interviewed by the Director. If the classroom interview goes well and the Director decides that the family is a good fit for Montessori Academy, parents will be notified by email of acceptance. Payment of the registration fee at that time will reserve your child's space. Parents must submit the Tennessee School Immunization Certificate, which may be obtained from your pediatrician.

Primary (3 - 6 years of age) - Parents must complete an application and questionnaire. Your child will then be placed in our wait pool. Because we seek balanced classrooms in both age and gender, we have a "wait pool" rather than a conventional wait list. When a possible space opens for your child, an interview and classroom visit will be scheduled, and the parents will be interviewed by the Director. If the classroom interview goes well and the Director decides that the family is a good fit for Montessori Academy, parents will be notified by email of acceptance. Payment of the registration fee at that time will reserve your child's space. Parents must submit the Tennessee School Immunization Certificate, which may be obtained from your pediatrician.

Lower Elementary / Upper Elementary / Middle School (6 - 15 years, 1st - 8th levels) - A two-day interview/visit for your child in the classroom will be scheduled. On the close of the second day of your child's visit, an administrator will speak with the parents at 3:15 p.m. in the office. Final acceptance is contingent upon evaluations of: (1) a successful interview and visit, (2) the candidate's transcripts, and (3) the assessment forms completed by former teachers. Parents must submit the Tennessee School Immunization Certificate, which may be obtained from your pediatrician.

Fees and Commitments

Application Fee – \$150

This non-refundable fee must accompany the application form prior to additional admission procedures. This fee is paid only once during the time the child attends Montessori Academy. If the child leaves and returns to Montessori Academy the fee may be waived upon re-enrollment.

Registration of New Students – \$300

This non-refundable fee is due at the time the student is accepted.

Re-Registration of Current Students – \$150

This non-refundable annual fee is due on or before February 16, 2018 with the current student re-registrations. Fee is \$300 after February 16, 2018. Re-registration fee is pro-rated (\$75.00) for those families who initially enrolled between January and May 2018.

Parent Leadership Program

Volunteering at Montessori Academy models volunteer leadership to our children and affords parents the opportunity to be involved in the Montessori Academy Community. Parents are encouraged to work with Parent Coordinators to enhance the Montessori experience.

Tuition Payments

Tuition Late Fee

\$25 applied to monthly tuition payments received after the 4th of each month.

School Year Discounts

Families may receive a 2% discount on tuition (not After Care) if the yearly tuition is paid in full by August 1.

The following discounts are available to families for children registered for full-time 3:00 p.m. dismissal or later:

- Families receive a \$50 per month sibling discount on the 2nd child's tuition.
- Families receive a \$100 per month sibling discount on the 3rd child's tuition.
- Families receive a \$150 per month sibling discount on the 4th child's tuition.

Additional Sibling Discounts:

Families with 2 or more students *in Elementary* will receive a \$50 per month discount on the first child.
